OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE NEVADA COUNTY SHERIFF TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF BOATING AND WATERWAYS FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF BOATING SAFETY ENFORCEMENT COSTS, FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2019 TO JUNE 30, 2020, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$261,331.66

WHEREAS, the County of Nevada wishes to support law enforcement patrol on waterways within Nevada County; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada County Sheriff's Office wishes to submit an application to the California Department of Boating and Waterways for financial aid to partially reimburse boating safety enforcement costs associated with their Boating Safety and Enforcement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada County Sheriff's Office will request approval from the Nevada County Board of Supervisors if the monies are awarded.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Nevada County, to authorize the Sheriff to submit an application to the California Department of Boating and Waterways for financial aid in the amount of \$261,331.66, pertaining to reimbursement of Boat Patrol operations, for the period July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.

General Description of Boating Safety and Enforcement Programs;

The Marine Patrol Unit has two Deputy Sheriffs and a Sergeant assigned to the unit as the day to day operators of the unit during the summer months. These Deputies are the primary operators of the vessels for patrol and enforcement, as well as maintaining and repairing the vessels and other boating related equipment. During the summer months, when the use of the waterways in Nevada County are at their peaks, the Sheriff's Office supplements the Marine Patrol Unit with additional Deputy Sheriffs who work marine patrol on an overtime/as needed basis. During the balance of the year, the Marine Patrol Unit Deputies and their supervisor are responsible for the maintaining of the equipment and respond to call for service or events as needed.

The Marine Patrol Unit has three 20'-22' aluminum haul jet boats that are used for the primary patrol and enforcement on our waterways that regularly get pleasure and ski boat use during the summer months. During the winter the weather is usually cold and reduces the amount of boat traffic and use of the waterway to primarily fishing related activities. During the winter months the Marine Patrol Unit still patrols on days when it appears there is going to be vessels on the water recreating.

The Marine Patrol Unit also has a Sheriff's Sergeant assigned as the supervisor. This Sergeant has other primary duties so they are available to patrol during the summer months as needed. The Supervisor is also responsible for completing the annual reports and preparing the grant applications.

The only other marine safety and enforcement unit in Nevada County is operated by the Town of Truckee Police Department on Donner Lake. They have a patrol boat that is staffed on an as needed part-time basis. All other lake and waterways in Nevada County are under the jurisdiction of the Sheriff's Office
