**SUBJECT:** Resolution approving execution of Amendment 01 to the contract with Shellee Ann Sepko, LMFT, d/b/a What's Up? Wellness Checkups, for the provision of mental health screening services for high school students in eastern and western Nevada County, as a component of the County's Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) Plan to: 1) increase the Maximum Contract Price from \$106,150 to \$110,650 (an increase of \$4,500) for the contract term of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019, 2) revise Exhibit "A" Schedule of Services to reflect a change in performance measures, and; 3) Exhibit "B" Schedule of Charges and Payments to reflect the increase in the maximum contract price.

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**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the attached Resolution.

**FUNDING:** Contract services are funded by MHSA (Mental Health Services Act) Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) dollars. PEI funding is intended to support strategies to help identify and increase prevention efforts and responses to early signs of emotional and behavioral health problems among specific at-risk populations. There are no county general fund dollars required.

**BACKGROUND:** Every community and school hopes to develop a roadmap for the success of all students, and it has become evident that schools cannot focus solely on the academic success of young people. Both the physical and mental well-being of a young person has direct implications for that youth's ability to be productive as a student and as a member of their school and

community. Embracing the concept of the whole child has led schools and communities to integrate systems that address the academic, social, and emotional needs of teens.

Teen Screen Schools and Communities is a national mental health and suicide risk screening program developed by Columbia University's Division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry in response to research revealing that 90 percent of youth who die by suicide suffer from a diagnosable mental illness and that 64 percent experience symptoms for at least a year prior to their deaths.

Under this agreement, the Contractor will continue to implement the Teen Screen model to make voluntary mental health checkups available to all of Nevada County's ninth graders in the Nevada County Joint Union High School District and the Tahoe Truckee Unified School District and any other high school students referred by the schools and/or parents.

This amendment will specifically ensure that a minimum of 50 ninth and tenth grade Tahoe Truckee Unified School District (TTUSD) will be screened.

The Contractor shall establish a Project Team which will include the following core positions: a Project Director and a Community Resource Coordinator who will coordinate efforts to offer screening in participating Nevada County schools. In addition, the Contractor will make available translation/interpretation services to create opportunities for outreach in the Hispanic communities in Grass Valley and Truckee on an as-needed basis and provide Group Facilitation services for on-campus prevention groups including recruitment, coordinating services through student assistance programs, facilitating groups and evaluation of group effectiveness. The program is completely voluntary, and parental consent and youth assent are required for participation in the program. The program involves the following stages:

- Obtaining parental consent;
- Participant Assent:
- Screening Questionnaire
- Clinical/Debriefing Interview;
- Parent Notification.

It is recommended that the Board approve this renewal contract as it provides services that can intervene with at-risk youth and connect them with the mental health services that can help save lives.
