SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of a revenue Standard Agreement Number 26XS0005 with the California Department of Veterans Affairs, for Veteran Mental Health Outreach Services, in the maximum amount of \$120,000, for the term of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2028.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: Allotted through the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Prop 63 to the California Department of Veterans Affairs (CDVA) to enhance the effectiveness of referrals to County Veteran Service Offices (CVSO) for veterans who present with mental health issues. Under this agreement, Nevada County is being awarded \$120,000 for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2028 to help improve the mental health and well-being of veterans in the community. Notification of the award was received too late to be incorporated into the FY 26/27 budget. A budget amendment will be presented to the Board following the approval of the FY 26/27 budget. There are no county general fund requirements for this agreement.

BACKGROUND: The CDVA Prop 63 is now an annual competitive grant. Nevada County has been a recipient of this grant continuously since the 2018-2019 FY. Nevada County Veterans Service Office will contract with Sierra Family Therapy Center to perform mental health outreach throughout the county and will provide therapy to veterans and their family members. Through partnership with multiple divisions of Nevada County Department of Social Services (DSS), Nevada County Department of Behavioral Health, Nevada County Superior Court System, a host of non-profits and local hospitals, the Veterans Outreach and Wellness Program will continue to connect veterans to the appropriate services for support and treatment.

It is recommended that the board approve the Agreement, as the funds received will help support programs that improve early identification of PTSD and other mental health concerns and improve access to treatment, which will lessen the severity of veterans' functional impairment and improve overall health.
