**SUBJECT:** Resolution authorizing the District Attorney's Office to apply for the US Department of Justice Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Rural Law Enforcement Violent Crime Reduction Initiative for up to \$400,000 for Fiscal Year 2026/27 through 2028/29, and to authorize the District Attorney to execute the grant application and other application documents.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt the Resolution.

**FUNDING:** The maximum award is \$400,000 and will be distributed via reimbursement over the course of the 36-month grant period, which is anticipated to be June 1, 2026-May 30, 2029. No match is required.

**BACKGROUND:** The Rural Law Enforcement Violent Crime Reduction Initiative seeks to support local law enforcement in rural jurisdictions to prevent, respond to, and reduce violent crime. The goal is to equip rural law enforcement agencies and prosecutors' offices with the resources necessary to implement a violent crime reduction strategy to solve a specific violent crime challenge through technological enhancements, personnel, tactics, training and equipment, and/or data analytics and intelligence. This program supports cooperative efforts that utilize a regionalized approach among multiple rural agencies to reduce violent crime. It is funded through the US Department of Justice and Office of Justice Programs. The total amount to be awarded under this funding opportunity is \$5,838,546 with an anticipated number of fifteen awards.

The District Attorney's Office is applying for the full award of \$400,000 to support the purchases and implementation of software and equipment to be used in the collaborative High-Tech Crimes Task Force, which consists of collaborating partners from the District Attorney's Office, Grass Valley Police Department, Nevada City Police Department, Truckee Police Department, and the Nevada County Sheriff's Office.

We are requesting:

- Approval to apply for this grant, and

- Authorization for the District Attorney to sign associated application documents required as outlined in the Notice of Funding Opportunity.

We have attached the grant Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for reference.

If awarded, the grant will be brought to the Board for approval.
