



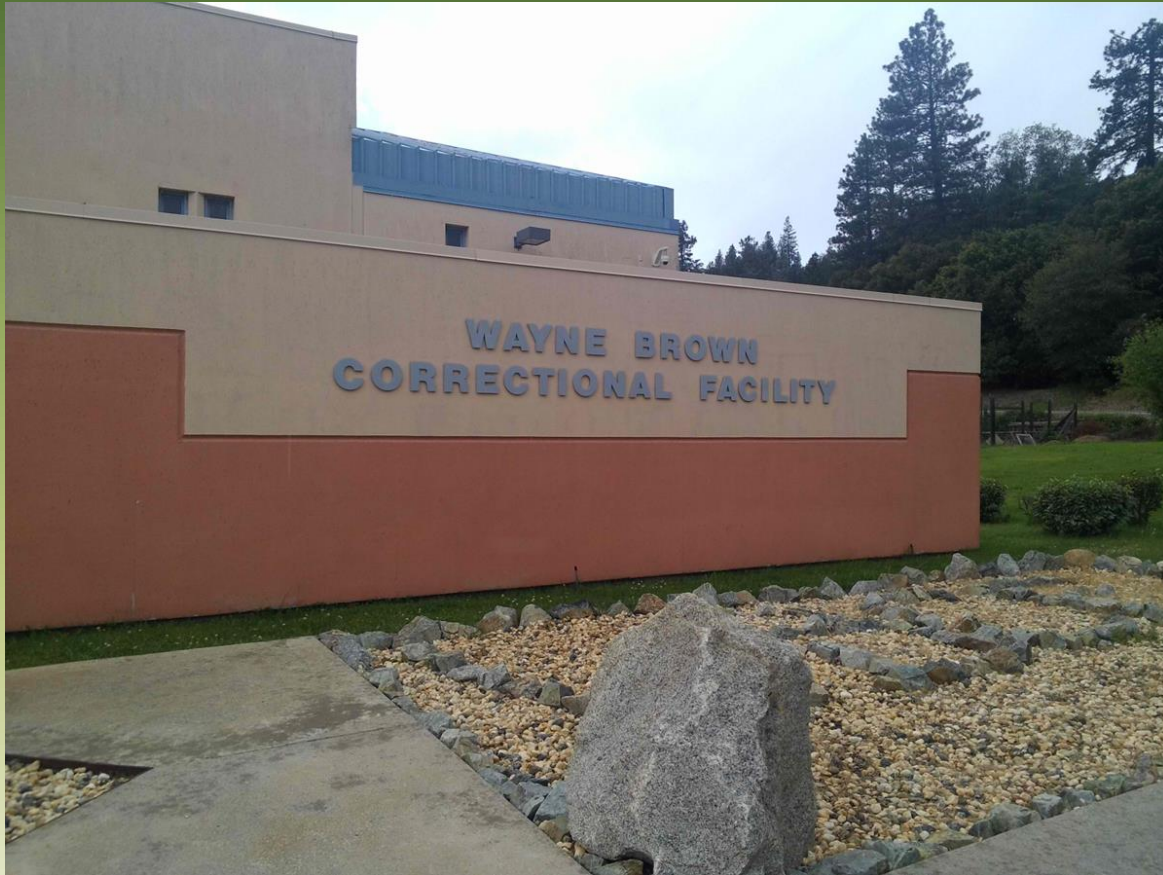

T.R.U.T.H. Act

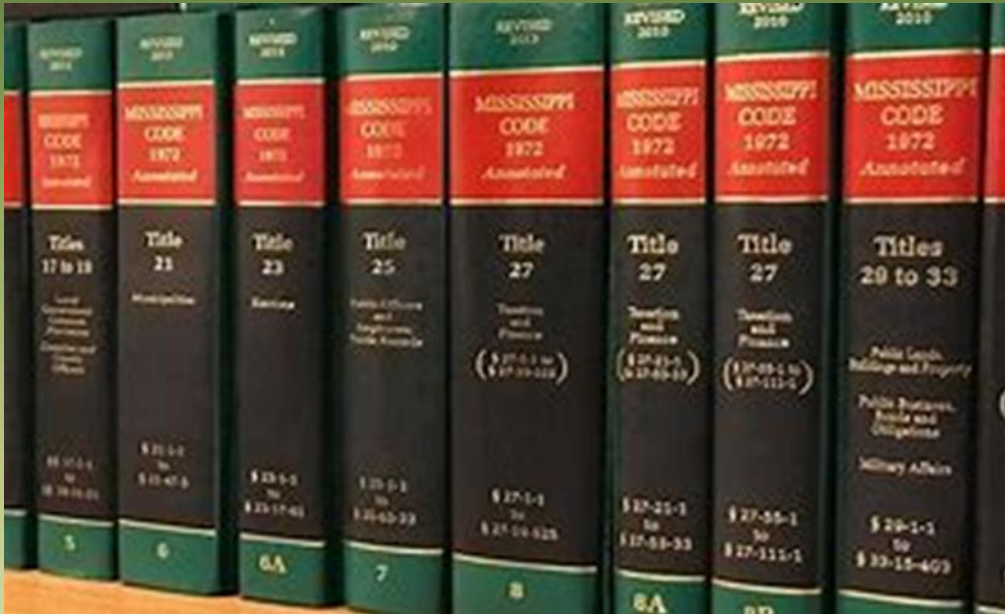


- Approved by CA Governor Brown on September 26, 2016
- Requires NCSO to provide an Incarcerated Person with a written consent form prior to I.C.E. interview
- Provides criteria to NCSO for cooperating with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (I.C.E.)
- NCSO established policies and procedures
- Corrections POLICY 502
- Addresses requirements of Government Code 7283-7283.2 and 7282.5



Government Codes

- **Government Code 7282.5**
 - Identifies charges and conditions that must be met for Incarcerated Persons to be held for I.C.E.
- **Government Code 7283**
 - Defines which Incarcerated Person data should be presented at the yearly community forum
- **Government Code 7283.1**
 - Outlines process (providing forms, information availability, community forum)
- **Government Code 7283.2**
 - Specifies chapter doesn't change authority to detain based upon an I.C.E. hold



NCSO Policy 502.3.2 thru 502.3.5

- **Notify Incarcerated Person if jail receives a hold request from I.C.E.**
 - This notice includes whether NCSO plans to comply with the request
- **One additional person designated by Incarcerated Person will also receive copy of I.C.E. request , if we notify I.C.E. of their pending release (i.e., An attorney)**
- **All I.C.E. requests for interviews are voluntary**
- **All forms are available in several different languages**



PROCESS

- Incarcerated Person is booked into Wayne Brown Correctional Facility (WBCF) or Truckee Jail
- I.C.E. is automatically notified via Live Scan (Fingerprinting)
 - I.C.E. may send a detainer request to NCSO
- If I.C.E. sends a detainer request, notification is given to the Incarcerated Person
- If I.C.E. requests to interview an Incarcerated Person, consent forms are given to the Incarcerated Person. The interview is **VOLUNTARY**
 - If Incarcerated Person consents, they are interviewed by I.C.E.
- NCSO notifies I.C.E. of release, **ONLY** if Incarcerated Person meets specific criteria under the T.R.U.T.H. Act



I.C.E. Access for 2025

“I.C.E. access” means, for the purposes of civil immigration enforcement, including when an individual is stopped with or without their consent, arrested, detained, or otherwise under the control of the local law enforcement agency, all the following:

- 1) Responding to an I.C.E. hold, notification, or transfer request**
 - WBCF/TKE responded to 0
- 2) Providing notification to I.C.E. in advance of the public that an individual is being or will be released at a certain date and time through data sharing or otherwise.**
 - WBCF/TKE responded to 0
- 3) Providing I.C.E. non-publicly available information regarding release dates, home addresses, or work addresses, whether through computer databases, jail logs, or otherwise.**
 - WBCF/TKE does not provide this information to I.C.E. through databases, jail logs, etc.
- 4) Allowing I.C.E. to interview an individual**
 - I.C.E. did NOT conduct any interviews
- 5) Providing I.C.E. information regarding dates and times of probation or parole check-ins.**
 - I.C.E. was NOT provided with this information



2025 Statistics

During 2025, there were 2916 Bookings

Of those incarcerated persons with some level of I.C.E. involvement, there were:

18 Bookings

- 17 bookings by local agencies on local charges
- 1 booking by a local agency on another county's warrant

This equates to .006% of 2025 bookings where an I.C.E. detainer request was received

18 Releases

- 17 released to the public
- 1 picked up by another county (Tuolumne County)



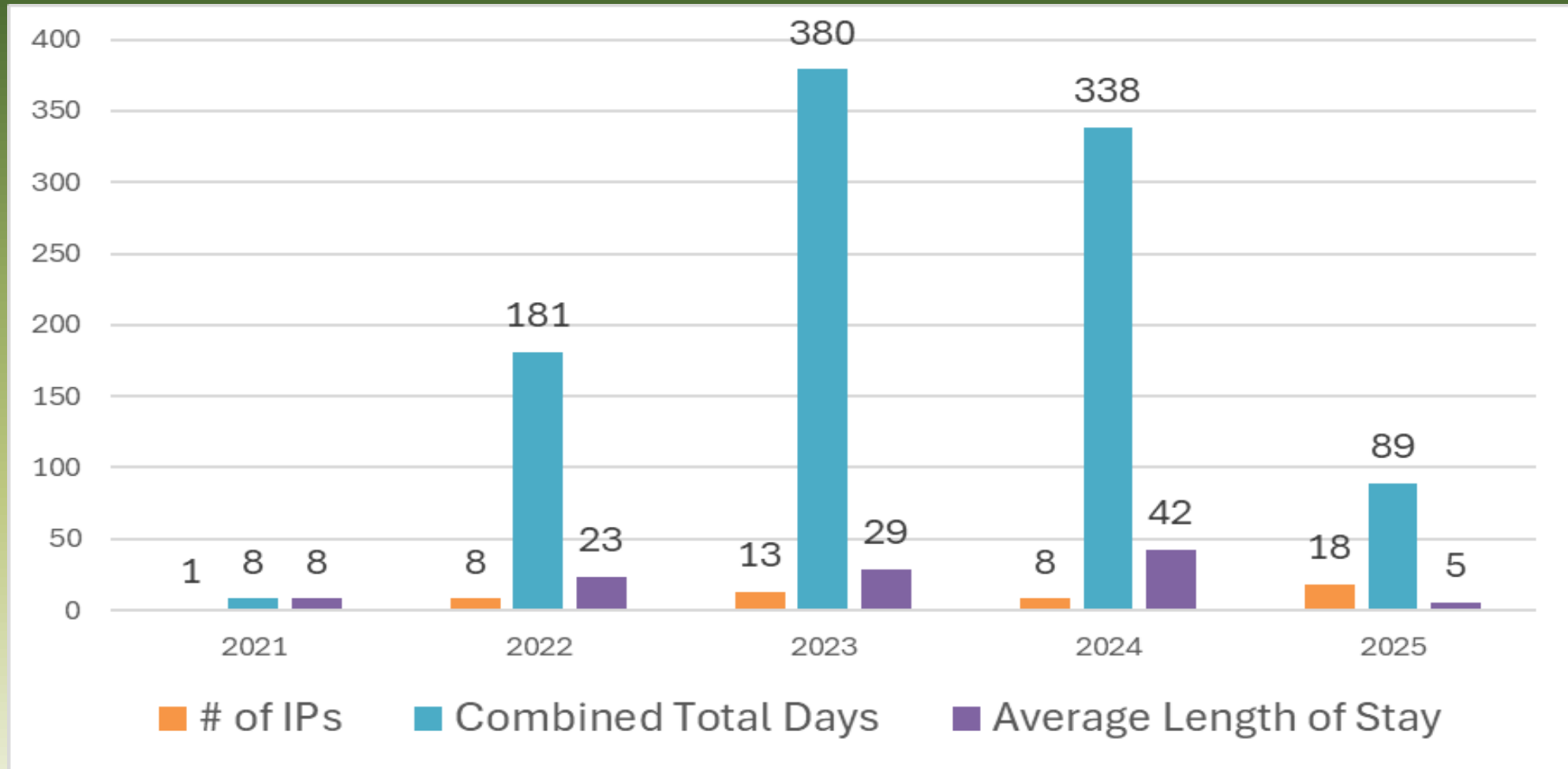
2025 Statistics Continued

The 18 Bookings that were in custody with an I.C.E. Detainer Request during 2025 were in custody for a total of 89 days combined.

5 days was the average length of stay for Incarcerated Persons with an I.C.E. Detainer Request

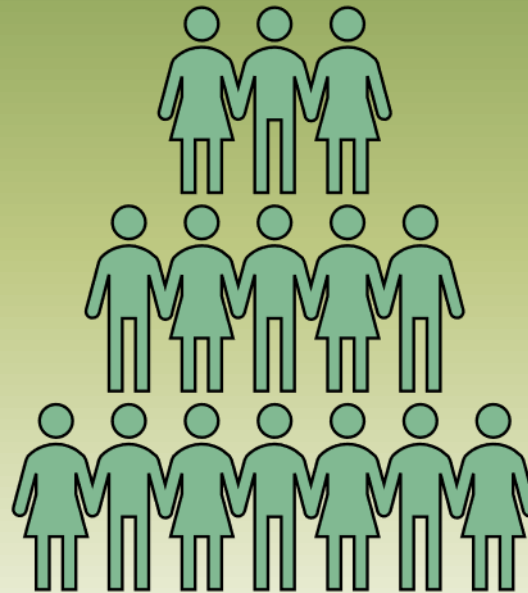
