OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES AGENCY DIRECTOR TO ACCEPT ANNUAL ALLOCATIONS OF COMMUNITY SERVICES BLOCK GRANT (CSBG) FUNDS, TO ACT AS SIGNATORY, AND TO EXECUTE ANNUAL CSBG AGREEMENTS, SUBSEQUENT AMENDMENTS, AND OTHER DOCUMENTATION AS REQUIRED BY THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SERVICES AND DEVELOPMENT (CSD)

WHEREAS, Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds are federal funds to support local services to low-income residents for a measurable impact on the causes and conditions of poverty; and

WHEREAS, upon the State's receipt of periodic allocations of federal CSBG funds, the California Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) distributes these to CSBG recipients in installments through an initial agreement and written notifications of availability of CSBG funds; and

WHEREAS, Nevada County receives an annual allocation from the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) fund; and

WHEREAS, Public Law 105-285 (the CSBG Act) and the California Government Code require that CSD secure a Community Action Plan (CAP) informed by a Community Need Assessment as a condition of funding; and

WHEREAS, every two years, the Adult and Family Services Commission brings to this Board for approval a Community Action Plan establishing a list of priorities for addressing and expending available CSBG funds to meet the needs of low-income residents; and

WHEREAS, to expedite the contract process and submit all contract deliverables to CSD in a timely manner, the Housing and Community Services Department wishes to establish ongoing signing authority to the Health and Human Services Agency Director; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Nevada County Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, State of California, that the Health and Human Services Agency director is authorized to accept annual allocations of Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds, to act as signatory, and to execute annual CSBG agreements, subsequent amendments, and other documentation as required by the California Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) to support services to improve the conditions of low-income residents, on behalf of the County.
