Greetings,

I have been a public health professional for over 25 years, first as a community health educator and more recently in health policy. I represent the California state chapter of Children's Health Defense (CHD), focusing on advocacy and legal defense in our state.

I ask that you vote in favor of SR 21-0178, the Resolution supporting reopening Nevada County safely.

First, I honor all losses we have endured this last year, personally and collectively.

To reopen safely we must restore a sense of confidence, safety and trust between each other and in the public domain. We need to look at what has caused all losses, including community coherence and preventable deaths.

Last March, we were told to isolate as SARS-Cov2 appeared in our country. The Reverse-Transcriptase Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test was given Emergency Use Authorization (EUA), for investigational and experimental use, and cannot be mandated by federal and state law (CA Health & Safety Code § 24172). The Nobel Prize inventor of the PCR test, Kary Mullis (who died August 2019), was very clear that the PCR test is used for research and cannot diagnose or determine if someone is sick or infectious. The PCR test should only be used in a clinical setting for those with symptoms, combined with an exam by a licensed medical professional. A positive result should then be clinically correlated with patient history and other diagnostic information to determine patient infection status.

The PCR test is being used experimentally. Any positive result is unconfirmed until the patient is also tested for flu, pertussis, tuberculosis, or many of the other 1400 human pathogens associated with symptoms similar to COVID-19. Without this additional standard differential diagnosis, any positive test results in confirmation bias, falsely attributing all symptoms like cough or a fever to COVID.

Misuse of the PCR test has increased unfounded fears by inflating the number of positive cases without confirmation of actual infection. Setting the Cycle threshold (Ct) above 35 cycles amplifies the viral load and is responsible for 97% of false positive tests. Public perception has been manipulated by changing the Cycle threshold to increase or decrease the number of cases, erroneously conflating it with infectiousness. So far, there have been over 900 lawsuits filed against the Centers for Disease Control and Health and Human Services to challenge this fraudulent reporting. People have also been deceived and divided against each other by misinformation about asymptomatic transmission, used to enforce self-suffocation by wearing a face mask. The imposition of face mask wearing is directly against controlled clinical trial evidence and against written policy in the Journal of the American Medical Association:

"There is no evidence to suggest that face masks worn by healthy individuals are effective in preventing people from becoming ill."

The Wuhan China study of 10 million residents demonstrated that asymptomatic transmission was non-existent when virus cultures were negative for all asymptomatic positive and re-positive cases.

Nevada County BOS has endorsed public health policies that have wrongly punished and divided our community. A test that delivers a majority of false positives doesn't measure infectiousness. True outbreaks are always driven by the symptomatic person; an epidemic is not driven by asymptomatic carriers.

Our community has been terrorized by fear, resulting in preventable losses of life and property. No one, not students or teachers, not our elderly or sick, should be victims of experimental tests or reckless, untested restrictions being used to enforce bullying and isolation from public life. Interrupting public comments, to tell people to cover their faces while speaking in an empty chamber, is psychological intimidation and coercion, not preventive health.

Please vote in favor of the resolution to begin the process of safely reopening our County. We deserve a full uncensored audit of deaths, and to know the full impacts of the COVID response, so we may begin to repair and restore our healthy community.

It does not force citizens to do anything. It does allow individuals to make informed decisions on how to conduct their lives, still in consideration of advice from local health authorities.

We have passed through the most severe period of this pandemic, multiple effective medical treatments exist, vaccines are being administered, new cases are decreasing, the survival rate is increasing, the warming weather in the months ahead will further decrease the activity of this virus, and our physical and mental well-being and our need for personal liberty requires we be treated as adults to make informed decisions.

States and countries that have not locked down their populations or picked essential and non-essential businesses have fared about the same as those that have imposed the most severe lockdowns and restrictions. And they have avoided the secondary physical and mental impacts of lockdowns.

Please allow our children to play sports! Professional sports and most collegiate sports are in full swing while our high schoolers and younger are being denied this very important right. Also, please allow our children to attend in-person, full time school. There are a few schools in the area and in other counties that have been open since early last fall!


