**SUBJECT:** Resolution approving execution of Amendment No. 2 to the renewal contract with Foothill House of Hospitality, DBA Hospitality House for the provision of transitional housing services through the Behavioral Health Bridge Housing program to revise Exhibit "A", Schedule of Services to reflect updates to the scope of service and revise Exhibit "B", Schedule of Charges to reflect changes in funding sources without changing the maximum contract price of \$1,792,322 for the term of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026. (RES 25-321) (RES 25-552)

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the attached Resolution.

**FUNDING:** Services are funded by Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (BHBH) funds, Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH), and Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funds made available to Nevada County. Services are within the Department's FY 2025/26 budget. There are no county general fund dollars required in the Agreement.

**BACKGROUND:** On June 24, 2025, per Resolution 25-321, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors approved execution of the Professional Services Contract with Foothill House of Hospitality, DBA Hospitality House for the provision of homeless outreach, access and linkage to treatment services, and transitional housing services through the Behavioral Health Bridge Housing program and Encampment Resolution Funds. The contract was subsequently amended on December 16, 2025 per Resolution 25-552 to add incentive dollars for participation in the Mental Health Services Act Innovation Learning Collaborative.

Amendment No. 2 will allow for changes to the scope of services and funding sources for the provision of transitional housing services. The amendment updates the scope of work for the

provision of twenty-eight beds of transitional housing, increases the Behavioral Health Bridge Housing funding, and removes Encampment Resolution Funding and reporting requirements from the contract for the remainder of the fiscal year. This shift will streamline administrative and fiscal monitoring for both the County and the Contractor.

It is recommended that the Board approve this Amendment No. 2 as it will allow for streamlined administrative and fiscal monitoring within the provision of transitional housing services for unhoused individuals in Nevada County.
