BACKGROUND:

National Crime Victims' Rights Week has been celebrated every year in April since 1981. This week is dedicated to education on victimization, the effect victimization has on individuals, families, friends, and the community, and to promote laws, policies, and programs to help victims of crime. Every year, thousands of communities across the nation honor the dedication of those before us that established victim rights and renew commitment to guarantee that all victims have the rights and services they need to recover from crime.

This year's theme is "Connecting < KINSHIP > Healing". This year's theme of KINSHIP is a call to action to recognize that shared humanity should be at the center of supporting all survivors and victims of crime. KINSHIP is a state of being with survivors that drives vital connections and increases access to services, rights, and healing.

This year's public outreach for National Crime Victims' Rights Week will include daily interviews on local radio, social media updates, attendance at the State Capital event and a special Victim recognition presentation.

By issuing this proclamation, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors will formally recognize the importance of having a victim service and criminal justice response that assists all victims of crime; acknowledges the work of the service providers; and recognizes the needs of our victims and survivors.
