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The Nevada County Mental Health And Substance Use Advisory Board shall Review and evaluate the community's needs, services, facilities, and special problems in relation to mental health, substance use, and co-occurring mental health and substance use issues in order to provide more effective programs for the benefit of all residents of Nevada County; Review any County agreements entered into pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 5650 and 14124.21; and Section 11772 of the Health and Safety Code; Advise the Board of Supervisors, the NCBH Director and/or the AOD Program Manager, as appropriate, regarding any aspect concerning NCBH, and NCBH contracted, mental health, alcohol, drug, and co-occurring disorder programs; review and approve the procedures used to ensure citizen and professional involvement at all stages of the planning process; submit an annual report to the Board of Supervisors outlining and evaluating the performance of local mental health, substance use and co-occurring mental health and substance use programs, other available services, and unmet needs within our county; review and make recommendations on applicants for the appointment of a local director of mental health services.

The Board shall consist of thirteen (13) members. Members shall be appointed from a pool of applicants recommended by the Advisory Board who, to the extent possible, have experience and knowledge of mental illness and substance use, and the County Behavioral Health Department. A member of the Board of Supervisors or his/her designee shall serve as an Advisory Board member (the thirteenth member) plus the Chair shall also appoint another member of the Board of Supervisors to serve as alternate to the primary supervisor member. Members shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors from the community-at-large and shall serve for 3-year terms.

At least 50% of the Advisory Board membership shall be consumers, who are receiving or have received mental health, substance use, or co-occurring mental health and substance use services, or the parents, spouse, sibling or adult children of consumers. Of these 50%, at least 30% shall be consumers, and at least 20% shall be families of consumers. Except as provided in the current Bylaws, no member of the Advisory Board or his/her spouse shall be a full-time or part-time County employee of a County mental health or substance use service, an employee of the State Department of Health Care Services, or an employee of, or a paid member of the governing body of, a mental health or substance use contract agency.
