**SUBJECT:** Resolution accepting the California Office of Emergency Services Grant Award VV25022601 for the Nevada County District Attorney's Office for the Violence Against Women Vertical Prosecution Program in the amount of \$202,545.00 for the period of January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026, and authorizing the District Attorney, or their designee(s), to execute the grant agreement and all additional documents to fulfill the grant requirements (Federal Subaward).

**RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt the Resolution.

**FUNDING:** The California Office of Emergency Services grant award is comprised of Federal Services Training Officers Prosecutors (STOP) funds in the amount of \$202,545.00. The funding cycle runs on the calendar year from January to December and has been included in the fiscal year 2025-26 District Attorney budget. This grant requires a match of 25% of the award, which was also included in the fiscal year 2025-26 District Attorney budget. No budget amendment is necessary.

**BACKGROUND:** This CalOES grant is a non-competitive award designed to improve services for women victims of violent crimes by supporting a coordinated, multidisciplinary vertical prosecution team consisting of a highly qualified prosecutor, victim advocate, and investigator. This marks the third of five years in which we have received this grant. We remain eligible for funding for two additional consecutive years, contingent upon satisfactory performance and the availability of future funds.

These funds will primarily support a .50 FTE experienced attorney that will be dedicated to this caseload. To allow this attorney to focus on these cases, we have employed a temporary attorney to backfill the caseload that will need to be moved and redistributed from the experienced attorney. These funds will also support .25 FTE of a District Attorney Investigator that will dedicate that time to investigations related to this caseload.

This grant requires a matching contribution of \$67,515.00. The match will be met through a 0.51 FTE Victim Advocate position dedicated to serving the victims of the cases managed by the dedicated prosecutor.
