Mental Health Student Services Act (MHSSA) Background

- Competitive grant through the Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (MHSOAC) to expand mental health services in schools
- Program and application developed through close partnership with Nevada County Superintendent of Schools (NCSOS)
- NCBH awarded \$2,499,448 from September 1, 2021, to August 31, 2025;
 vast majority of these funds are awarded to NCSOS for programming and staffing



Nevada County MHSSA Program

- Focuses on 8 elementary schools:
 - 1. Bell Hill Academy Elementary School
 - 2. Scotten Elementary School
 - 3. Deer Creek Elementary School
 - 4. Williams Ranch Elementary School
 - 5. Ready Springs Elementary School
 - 6. Alta Sierra Elementary School
 - 7. Cottage Hill Elementary School
 - 8. Grizzly Hill Elementary School



Nevada County MHSSA Program

- 8 Registered Behavioral Technicians (RBTs) and 2 Board Certified Behavioral Analysts (BCBAs) hired through NCSOS and embedded at elementary schools
- Increases in-classroom behavioral support and capacity
- Strengthens connections and referral flow between school behavioral support staff and county behavioral health services
- Challenges include staffing, but overwhelmingly positive feedback from families, teachers, and school administration from pilot program year
- In the first 6 months of the MHSSA program, 29 students have been served



Upcoming Changes

- Recently awarded \$674,602 through 2025 to:
 - Expand current program to include BCBA and RBTs at middle schools
 - Add Lead BCBA position to oversee and supervise the program including clinical supervision and data reporting requirements
