RE: Nevada County Wildfire Prevention, Emergency Services and Disaster Readiness Transactions and Use Tax: "Pay Me Now or Pay Me Later"

## Dear Sirs and Madams,

As a 20-year Nevada County resident, a day does not go by when my mind has some level of focus on the potential for a wildfire in our community. No one can dispute we are in a wildfire crisis that our community must address immediately, or our future will suffer the devastation of Paradise and Greenville. In the short term, I fear the loss of property value and local economic growth due to the extreme wildfire potential in our community.

The question is how can we meet this challenge?

Early evidence is that fuel reduction is working to lessen the impact of community damage due to wildfire, and also supports the efforts of heroic firefighters. However, the costs of fuel reduction work, plus the creation of emergency evacuation routes and fire-hardening our structures are extraordinarily high.

Private landowners can only bear a small percent of the cost (\$3,000 per acre on average). Fuel reduction is not a one-time thing. It must be an annual investment by property owners, and could be considered itself as a "tax." While federal, state and private grants are available to some who meet the stringent qualifications, these are too small and not accessible for too many people. Critical secondary emergency routes are not being created because private property owners— individually or as neighborhoods could never fund these "public works" projects, and no public funds exist to subsidize them. No coordinated effort exits for applying funds to the most critical needs.

This is not a problem that individual private property owners can address alone. It takes a coordinated community solution.

A new funding stream, that would be managed in a coordinated way so that investments are made in places of highest risk to the most important assets, that cannot be addressed through other available resources is needed. The proposed ordinance/ballot measure to Article 9 to Chapter V of the Nevada County General Code imposing a one-half cent "Nevada County Wildfire Prevention, Emergency Services and Disaster Readiness Transactions and Use Tax" for critical emergency services makes the most sense for the times we live in.

No one likes an increase in taxes. But this is a "pay me now or pay me later" situation. Property owners may scoff at an additional half cent tax, but the cost of fuel reduction on our own is far more expensive, and the cost of rebuilding when our community burns in a wildfire is worse. Such a tax could also ensure the funds would be applied to the most critical areas of need, to protect all of us, rather than the areas only property owners of certain wealth can afford to do.

I urge the Nevada County Board of Supervisors to let the voters decide and adopt the proposed ordinance/ballot measure be placed on the next regularly scheduled County and Statewide General Election on November 8, 2022.



This plan is responsible for establishing shaded fire breaks, improving evacuation routes, education, increased Firefighting staff and equipment to name a few. It appears to be successful and worth the cost but I have never read reports on cost versus benefits of the program and that bothers me.

I support the  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent measure be placed on the November ballot. However, it is worth noting that the proposal is coming at a time of high inflation, high food and energy costs.

I am writing on behalf of Ananda Village where I serve as community manager to some 220 residents on the San Juan Ridge.

Additionally I serve as a volunteer firefighter EMR with the North San Juan Fire Protection District, and sit on the board of the San Juan Ridge Taxpayers Association.

Obviously we are deeply concerned about wildfire in our area--I know firsthand that it is not a question of IF but WHEN. This is the single most unifying issue we all face together, year after year. California has now established the Wildfire and Forest Resilience Plan. This plan is responsible for establishing shaded fire breaks, improving evacuation routes, education, increased Firefighting staff and equipment to name a few. It appears to be successful and worth the cost but I have never read reports on cost versus benefits of the program and that bothers me.

I support the  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent measure be placed on the November ballot. However, it is worth noting that the proposal is coming at a time of high inflation, high food and energy costs.

For these reasons, I believe any tax or fee should be temporary (5 to 10 yrs), have civilian unbiased oversight and a well thought-out plan for all to see and a yearly report.
