Nevada County Board of Supervisors,

I would like to support this tax—I feel it's not just urgent but emergent that the county steps into its responsibility of vegetation mitigation. Polling has indicated residents are eager to support vegetation mitigation and many, myself included, feel this can has been kicked down the road for far too long. I want to support a tax for vegetation mitigation and I want to help others to understand the necessity of supporting it.

That said, I feel it is the number one responsibility of the county to **do no harm**. Words matter. And the current wording of this proposed tax measure is disingenuous and misleading. The current wording will harm our local fire districts.

For the past several weeks—since the Terry MacAteer/Susan Rogers campaign to line up speakers in support of this proposed tax measure sprung into high gear, I have been the recipient of numerous emails and phone calls asking me for help in drafting comments and comment letters. 100% of those who contacted me shared their delight that this tax would provide funding to support local fire agencies.

Perception is reality. One needs to look no further than the RL Crabb Facebook post sharing his recent cartoon on the subject. Nowhere in his cartoon did he use the words "fire tax", yet nearly every comment in response used those exact words. The perception of this proposed tax is that it will provide desperately needed funding to local fire districts. It does not. Not one cent. Yet, the perception based on comments of fairly informed citizens suggest this tax would staff stations, increase the number of firefighters, and increase benefits and salaries of fire professionals.

The county needs to acknowledge that words indeed matter. It needs to remove the suggestion and the impression that fire agencies benefit from this tax proposal. It needs to title it for that which it is intended—Vegetation Mitigation.

It feels like an easy fix. Make it clear that fire districts don't get this money. Not one dime.

A good deal of the confusion may come from the Response section that mentions fire hand crews. The county is not in the fire business and therefore has no ability to train, certify, supervise and/or manage fire personnel. Since the county isn't in the fire business to whom, specifically, would the \$1.8M go?

Unless and until the county is willing to articulate a solid plan defining exactly who would receive the proposed \$1.8M referenced as fire hand crews, any suggestion that hand crews will respond to fires needs to be removed. *I will not speak to the implications of this line item.* The county can surely pass this measure without implying it funds fire resources.

Although few understand how local fire districts are funded, Nevada County does not provide funding for fire protection. The county has been historically unwilling to fund local fire districts, even those that are insolvent. Citizens are unaware of this reality and continually suggest to local district boards that they appeal to the county for more tax money to meet growing financial challenges. The wording of this measure adds further confusion to this misunderstanding and, intentionally or unintentionally, leads voters to believe such a measure would provide support to fire districts. This makes the already difficult task of passing district wide tax measures to increase staffing less likely and is **not collaborative**.

Do. No. Harm.

I ask that you not move forward with this necessary and important tax measure until you have addressed the concerns I have listed. I humbly ask for your no vote today to allow time to properly prepare this proposed tax initiative, taking into concern all who would be harmed by the current wording.

Thank you for all that you do to serve the needs of Nevada County, and your dedication to meeting the priorities set to preserve our quality of life.



Dear Supervisor Miller,

The Greater Grass Valley Chamber of Commerce is grateful that as we approach the fire season, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors Objectives has Emergency Preparedness set as a priority. We are very much in favor of Wildfire Prevention, Emergency Services, and Disaster Readiness, and commend your attention to this peril that threatens our community. We do, however, have concerns about the above noted measure and the proposed method of funding.

Having learned about this measure on July 14<sup>th</sup>, we immediately reached out to colleague organizations in West and East County to ascertain their knowledge of this measure. All but one had no knowledge the Ready Nevada County's Preparing For the Future: Wildfire Prevention, Emergency Services and Disaster Readiness Measure. Given the lack of engagement with our organizations and the public at large prior to that date, we feel that there has not been a meaningful opportunity to engage in public discussion.

Our organization's concerns mirror those of the Grass Valley Downtown Association in terms of this measure's impact on the retail economy, and we are unable to support this measure as it is written..

- There is no sunset date proposed in this measure.
- Lack of specificity regarding ballot and program language and detail.
- No public engagement to date.
- Fire Response (no additional fire personnel) is not included in this measure.
- Equitable Return to Source is not included in this measure.

We respectfully request that the Supervisors table this measure, engage in a robust discussion with community partners and community stakeholders to determine the best possible method of creating a Special Tax, directed specifically toward achieving the worthy objectives of this measure.
