

# PUBLIC NOTICE OF COMMITTEE VACANCIES

August 30, 2022

The Nevada County Board of Supervisors is seeking interested persons to serve on the following:

#### \*ADULT AND FAMILY SERVICES COMMISSION: (3 vacancies)

Two Public Sector vacancies for two-year terms ending April 30, 2024 and; one Private Sector vacancies, for unexpired two-year term ending April 30, 2023. This Commission shall operate under the Nevada County Board of Supervisors as the primary advisory body relative to health and human service's needs and performs the responsibilities of the Board of Directors as described under Title 42 USC Chapter 106 § 9910 - Tripartite Boards. Private Sector members shall represent labor, business, or other private business, industry, labor, religious, human services, education, or other major groups and interests in the community. #### \*AREA 4 AGENCY ON AGING ADVISORY COUNCIL: (1 vacancy)

One Board of Supervisors appointed representative for an unexpired three-year term ending June 30, 2025. The Advisory Council shall advise the area agency on all matters relating to development and administration of the Area Plan and operations conducted thereunder. #### \*ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD: (3 vacancies, 1 position)

One vacancy for regular member to fill an unexpired three-year term ending September 30, 2023 and two vacancies for alternate members to fill one-year terms beginning October 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2023. One regular member position available October 1, 2022 for three-year term ending September 30, 2025. Specific qualifications are required per Section 1624 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. The function of the Appeals Board is to determine the full value of property or to determine other matters of property tax assessment over which the Appeals Board has jurisdiction. The Board acts in a quasi-judicial capacity and renders its decision only on the basis of proper evidence presented at the hearing. The functions of the Board are outlined in Section 1620 et seq. of the Revenue and Taxation Code. Compensated per Administrative Code Chapter II, Article 13.11. \*BUILDING AND ACCESSIBILITY STANDARDS BOARD OF APPEALS: (2 vacancies) One member-at-large vacancy to be filled by a person with a disability who is qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to building construction, building service equipment and grading, for an unexpired four-year term ending July 1, 2023. One vacancy for member appointed by District I Supervisor, to be selected from the County at large, for term unexpired term ending December 31, 2023. This Board rules on appeals of discretionary orders, decisions or determinations made by the Building Official relative to the application and interpretation of the provisions of the technical codes. #### <u>CITIZENS' OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE OF THE NEVADA COUNTY LIBRARY:</u> (2 vacancies)

Two member vacancies to fill unexpired four-year terms ending March 31, 2025. To ensure that the Eastern and Western Nevada County libraries receive equitable amounts of the Nevada County Library Fund and operate in accordance with the Nevada County Library Strategic Plan, residents from Eastern County are encouraged to apply. This Committee reviews, advises, and monitors the library's revenues, expenditures, and services. The goals of this committee are 1) to ensure that the County of Nevada receives all library tax monies collected by the Board of Equalization and that those monies are placed in the Nevada County Library Fund; 2) to ensure that the county of Nevada annually transfers its maintenance and effort funds, under the provisions of state laws, to the Nevada County Library Fund; 3) to ensure that the Eastern and Western Nevada County libraries are receiving equitable amounts of the Nevada County Library Fund and operate in accordance with the Nevada County Library Strategic Plan; 4) to review and advise the County Librarian on the Strategic Plan and the annual County Library Budget; and 5) to facilitate the free flow of regular communication between the Committee and all interested library patrons and organizations. #### \*HISTORICAL LANDMARKS COMMISSION: (1 vacancy)

One District I registered voter to be appointed by the District I Supervisor. The purpose of this commission shall be to promote the general welfare of Nevada County and its citizens through official recognition, recording, marking, preserving, and promoting the historical resources of Nevada County. ### \*KINGSBURY GREENS COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT: (3 vacancies)

Three residents of Kingsbury Greens CSD to fill unexpired terms ending December 4, 2024. The District shall provide for the collection, treatment, and disposal of sewage, waste and storm water of the district and its residents. #### MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE ADVISORY BOARD: (3 vacancies)

Three vacancies, one to fill an unexpired three-year term ending June 30, 2023 and two vacancies for term ending June 30, 2025. The vacancies and positions can be filled by Consumer, Family or General Members. This Board reviews and evaluates the community's mental health needs, services, facilities, and special problems; reviews any County agreements entered into pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5650; advises as to any aspect of the local mental health program; reviews and approves the procedures used to ensure citizen and professional involvement at all stages of the planning process; and submits an annual report to the Board of Supervisors. #### NEVADA COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT NO. 1 ADVISORY COMMITTEE: (10 vacancies)

#### \*PENN VALLEY AREA MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL: (1 vacancy)

One-member vacancy for unexpired two-year term ending June 30, 2023. All applicants must reside within Supervisorial District IV boundaries that are within either the Western Gateway Regional Recreation and Park District or the Penn Valley Fire Protection District. Individuals are selected by District IV Supervisor Susan Hoek and their appointment are acknowledged by the Board of Supervisors. #### \*SEWAGE DISPOSAL TECHNICAL ADVISORY GROUP: (3 vacancies)

One consultant appointed by District II Supervisor, one consultant appointed by District IV Supervisor, and one consultant appointed by District V Supervisor, each selected from the County-at-large to serve at the pleasure of the appointing Supervisor. Consultant is defined in County of Nevada On-Site Sewage Disposal Ordinance 1975 as one of the following; Certified Engineering Geologist, Certified Professional Soil Scientist, Registered Civil Engineer, Registered Environmental Health Specialist, or Registered Geologist. Said group members may not be employees of the County of Nevada. Each group member will be qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to sewage disposal. The purpose will be to review and recommend proposed revisions and additions to the sewage disposal regulations or sewage disposal ordinance in an advisory capacity; review and recommend new methods, techniques, and materials for on-site sewage disposal, in an advisory capacity; and serve as an appeal body under the provisions of Section A-032 of County Resolution 98-217. \*SOLID AND HAZARDOUS WASTE COMMISSION (NEVADA COUNTY): (3 vacancies) Two Citizen-At-Large Representatives and one Local Business Representative to fill two-year terms ending January 31, 2024. This Commission will assist the County in the development of a comprehensive long-range plan for the disposal and recycling of solid and hazardous waste within the County, and the management of the County's solid waste operations, including all of the financial matters pertaining thereto. This commission shall a) establish fares; b) adopt the level of transit and paratransit services, including route structure and service areas; c) monitor public response; d) approve proposed purchase of additional vehicles; e) oversee on a regular basis and advise as necessary on the daily operations of the system; f) review and approve the annual budget for transit and paratransit operations; g) approve applying for grants for usual operation and /or for demonstration or study projects; h) direct staff to perform studies and analysis to evaluate options and alternative for providing transit and paratransit services on a short term and long term basis and report back to the Transit Commission; i) approve adjustments in the program in order to serve the public with maximum efficiency and services, including contracting with others for a portion of, or all of, transit, paratransit and ancillary services.
