- LOW COST TO COUNTY TO OBTAIN.
- REPLACED AN AGING ARMORED MONEY TRUCK



CONCLUSION: NO LONGER OPTIMAL OR PRACTICAL

BENEFITS TO ARMORED RESCUE VEHICLES

- FORCE MULTIPLIERS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT
 - > Effect rescues in "Hot" zones
 - > Used for decreasing distance & gathering intelligence
 - > UTILIZED BY CRISIS NEGOTIATORS IN MAKING SAFE CONTACT
 - ▶ DE-ESCALATION TOOL PROVIDING FOR MORE TIME TO DEVELOP PLANS FOR RESPONSE — "SLOW THINGS DOWN"

DRAWBACKS TO THE MRAP

- BUILT FOR MILITARY APPLICATIONS
- TREMENDOUS SIZE & WEIGHT (~48,000 POUNDS) SLOW
- ACCESS TO NARROW AND 4X4 ROADWAYS IS LIMITED
- ROLLOVER AND ENTRAPMENT CONCERNS.
- LACK OF DRIVER AND PASSENGER VISIBILITY
- DIFFICULT TO LOAD AND UNLOAD PASSENGERS
- REQUIRES COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE

PROPOSED REPLACEMENT - THE "BEARCAT"

- PURPOSE BUILT FOR DOMESTIC LAW ENFORCEMENT
- LIGHTER (~17,000LBS) MORE AGILE AND MANEUVERABLE
- BUILT ON A FORD F-550 SUPER DUTY CHASSIS
- OFF-ROAD RATED WITH RUN FLAT TIRES
- · CLASS "C" LICENSE ONLY
