#### Landscape Analysis -PIT Data 2019-2022

Key Takeaways:

- We are much better at counting
- 85 people identified through a new youth count
- 200 first time homeless (50% increase)
- 74% increase in sheltered
- More post treatment housing such as recovery residence
- Of those accessing shelter, more meet criteria for Chronic Homelessness
- COVID impacts
  - More funding to expand shelter
  - More people becoming homeless for the first time



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

## Landscape Analysis: PIT Count 2022







#### A. Prevention and Diversion - Reduce Inflow

A1 - Increase availability of rental and mortgage assistance funding to prevent individuals and families from slipping into homelessness and implement a CoC-wide diversion strategy.






