RESOLUTION ADOPTING DEVELOPMENT IMPACT MITIGATION FEES AND MITIGATION EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR THE TRUCKEE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, PURSUANT TO NEVADA COUNTY LAND USE AND DEVELOPMENT CODE SECTION L-IX 2.3

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada finds and declares as follows:

- A. Nevada County Land Use and Development Code Section L-IX 2.3 provides that the Board of Supervisors shall, by resolution, adopt development impact mitigation fees for fire protection; this is pursuant to the "Mitigation Fee Act" (Government Code Sections 66000, et seq., or "AB1600"); and
- B. The Truckee Fire Protection District (hereinafter, "the District") followed the procedures of the Mitigation Fee Act in its actions (Resolution No. 26-2022) on December 20, 2022, which public hearing resulted in a recommendation for a rate change from the previous year; and
- C. On December 21, 2022, the District sent a request for adoption of the rate change to Nevada County so that the fees can be made applicable in unincorporated Nevada County; and
- D. This Resolution of fee adoption is based upon the Truckee Fire Protection District Capital Improvement Plan and Mitigation Fee Expenditure Plan and its letter of December 21, 2022; and
- E. This Resolution has been considered after a public hearing for which notice was published as required by Government Code Section 66017(a).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors:

1. Based on the District's 2022 Truckee Fire Protection District Capital Improvement Plan and Mitigation Fee Expenditure Plan and its letter of December 21, 2022, the mitigation fees proposed by the District are hereby approved as follows:

- 2. The Fire impact Fees will be automatically adjusted for inflation each year by an amount equal to the percentage change in the Engineering News-Record Construction Cost Index (20-Cities) in the preceding twelve months.
- 3. This Resolution shall become effective and operative April 28, 2023 which is 60 days from the date of its adoption, pursuant to Government Code Section 66017(a).
- 4. A copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the Truckee Fire Protection District.

I have attached the District's Fire Mitigation Fee and Annual Expenditure Plan for FY 2022-23 ("Plan") for the District's fire impact fee program. The Plan was approved by the District Board of Directors ("District Board") on December 20, 2022, by Resolution No. 26-2022, which is also attached. The Plan includes the following:

- FY 2022-23 Capital Improvement Plan ("CIP")
- FY 2022-23 Annual Report in compliance with Government Code § 66006(b)
- District Board request for a 5.75% inflationary adjustment of the District's fire impact fee for the upcoming year.

The annual inflationary adjustment of the District's fire impact fee is tied to the nationally recognized Engineering News-Record Construction Cost Index (20-City Average). This annual inflationary adjustment is supported and requested by the Contractors Association of Truckee Tahoe ("CATT").

The District Board formally requests that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors ("County Board") adopt the District's CIP, the Annual Report, and the proposed inflationary adjusted fire mitigation fee for the upcoming year.

2022-2023 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN TRUCKEE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

Pursuant to Section 66006 of the Government Code, the District is required to annually make available to the public specific information related to the prior year's activity for development impact fees within 180 days after the last day of each fiscal year.

Truckee Fire Protection District collects mitigation fees within the Fire District boundaries, which include the Town of Truckee, and portions of both Nevada and Placer Counties. Mitigation fees were first approved by the Truckee Fire District Board of Directors in 1995; collection of the fees commenced thereafter.

The content of this report will outline the spending plan for those fees collected up to and including the fiscal year ending 6/30/2022. An annual inventory of fees collected to this point is available upon request.

FIRE IMPACT FEE SCHEDULE

An updated Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study was completed by SCI Consulting Group and approved by the Truckee Fire Protection District Board of Directors in November of 2021, Resolution 17-2021. The complete Study is available online at www.truckeefire.org or by calling (530) 582-7850.

The purpose of the Fire Impact Fees is to finance the public facilities and equipment as described. The current fee schedule is shown below. The District's fire impact fee is proposed to be adjusted by 5.7%, based on the percentage change in the 20-Cities Engineering News Record Construction Cost Index from September 2021 (12464) to September 2022 (13173). That fee schedule is shown below.
