

Youth Art Month: Young at Art Arts Education in Nevada County Schools

For at least the last 10 years, there has been a greater emphasis on the arts in education. In light of the past few years, the state of California has recently passed legislation, Proposition 28, which guarantees an annual funding stream for music and arts education. In 2023, this funding comes to roughly \$941 million, or 1% of the state's general fund.

Another source of revenue for schools is the 2022 Budget Act's one time Arts, Music, & Instructional Materials (AMIM) Discretionary Block Grant. Although there was a \$1.2 billion reduction from the AMIM Discretionary Block Grant (going from \$3.5 billion to \$2.3 billion), the opportunities for enhanced arts education will increase considerably. With this increased funding and the rollout of the 2019 Visual and Performing Arts Standards (the "what" to teach) and the 2020 Arts Framework (the "how" to teach), educators have robust guidelines to follow and resources to tap into, that will enrich students' educational experience.




