- Sustained through the time, talents & treasures of our staff, board, patrons, volunteers, donors, & business sponsors




IMPORTANCE OF MUSIC EDUCATION

- Students who participate in music programs score higher on standardized tests and have higher GPAs than students who do not
- In first graders, studying music has been shown to increase reading skills and math proficiency.
- Correlation shown between studying music and achievement in English and math.
- "The patterns of our findings quite clearly indicate that music participation especially in instrumental music, and multiple years of music engagement over time confers cognitive benefits in the form of tangible differences in many aspects of academic achievement and engagement in school," Gouzouasis says.
