**SUBJECT:** Resolution approving Amendment A1 to the Standard Agreement Number JP2014 from the California Volunteers for Youth Workforce Development Program maintaining the current amount of \$1,736,241 and extending the term end date from May 1, 2024 to September 30, 2024.

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**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the attached Resolution.

**FUNDING:** Approval of this State grant award will fund contract services focused on youth workforce development. There will be no general fund dollars required. The funding will go through September 30, 2024.

**BACKGROUND:** On June 22, 2022, per Resolution 22-315, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors authorized the execution of the Standard Agreement No. JP2014 by and between the County and the California Volunteers for CaliforniansForAll Youth Workforce Development Program. This amendment extends the expiration date only; there are no funding or service delivery changes with this amendment.

California Volunteers engages Californians in service, volunteering, and civic action to tackle our State's most pressing challenges. The CaliforniansForAll Youth Workforce Program is a Governor's initiative administered by California Volunteers in partnership with municipalities across California. The purpose of this initiative is to increase youth employment, develop youth interest in and experience towards a career, and to strengthen capacity to address key areas of climate, food insecurity, and local COVID-19 recovery.

State funds are available through Item 0650-163-8506 (California Volunteers - Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds) of the 2021 Budget Act. These funds were made available to California Volunteers through an investment by the Governor and the Legislature. Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, though administered through the State of California and California Volunteers, are federal stimulus funds associated with recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. Nevada

County Department of Social Services executed contracts with Bright Futures For Youth and Connecting Point to deliver the services for the Youth Workforce Development Program to Western and Eastern County. By authorizing this extension it allows for our grant award to be fully expended within the extended timeline of the grant.
