Historical Background

Cannabis evolved in Mongolia and southern Siberia approximately 12,000 years ago, and has been used medicinally and recreationally for 5000 years, according to University of Kansas Professor Barney Warf, author of "High Points: An Historical Geography of Cannabis"

Archeological evidence of Cannabis use has been found in China and Siberia dating back to 2500 B.C. Cannabis was used medicinally in China as early as 4000 B.C. and was used recreationally as well. Chinese coastal farmers brought cannabis to Korea about 2000 B.C. or earlier, and to the South Asian subcontinent between 2000 B.C. and 1000 B.C. Cannabis came to the Middle East between 2000 B.C. and 1400 B.C. It was likely carried northward to present day Ukraine and Russia, and was then brought westward into present day Germany by nomadic German tribes. Cannabis apparently went from there to Britain during the 5th century with the Anglo-Saxon invasions and was also used by the Vikings.

Cannabis then migrated to Africa, reached South America in the 19th century and arrived in the southwest United States from Mexico with immigrants fleeing that country during the Mexican Revolution of 1910-1911. According to Warf, early prejudices against marijuana were thinly veiled racist fears of its smokers, promulgated by reactionary newspapers, blaming "marijuana smoking" Mexicans for property crimes, seducing children and engaging in murderous sprees." The plant was first outlawed in Utah in 1915, followed by 28 other states. In 1937, thanks to the efforts of Harry Anslinger, first Director of the Federal Bureau of Narcotics, Congress passed the Marijuana Tax Act, criminalizing possession of the plant throughout the country

Current Regulation

Both federal and California laws generally prohibit the use, possession, cultivation, transportation, and furnishing of marijuana. However, California statutes, the Compassionate Use Act of 1996 ("CUA") added by initiative, Prop. 215, and subsequent legislation, including the 2003 Medical cannabis Program ("MMP"), removed certain prohibitions on the ability of "qualified patients" to cultivate, obtain and use marijuana. It also permitted qualified patients and their designated caregivers to engage in collective or cooperative cultivation of medical cannabis. Numerous other states, following California's lead, enacted medical cannabis laws and several states have enacted laws permitted adult recreational use of Cannabis.

While federal prohibitions on virtually all cannabis related activities are unchanged, in recent years there have been significant changes to federal enforcement policy. The Department of Justice ("DOJ") currently operates under the so-called "Cole Memorandum," which outlines enforcement priorities, recognizes that numerous states have enacted medicinal marijuana laws, and essentially establishes the policy of non-prosecution of those who are lawfully engaged in the medicinal cannabis industry under state law. Section 538 of the 2015 Budget Appropriations Act forbids the Department of Justice from expenditures to prevent states from implementing

their medical cannabis laws. On October 19, 2015, United States District Judge Charles Breyer ruled that Section 538 prohibited the Department of Justice from taking any actions to enforce an injunction which it had obtained against a cannabis dispensary which the DOJ had obtained in 2002. The ruling was affirmed by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, and was expressly based on the premise that the dispensary was at all times operating in compliance with the CUA and the MMP.

The MMP's exemption from criminal liability for collective or cooperative cooperation created the medical cannabis industry as it exists in California today:

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MCRSA

In 2015, the Legislature adopted the Medical cannabis Regulation and Safety Act ("MCRSA"), which will supplement and partially replace the MMP when it becomes effective. MCRSA creates a comprehensive scheme in which the cultivation, distribution and sale of medical cannabis will be regulated by existing state agencies (the Department of Consumer Affairs, the Department of Fish and Wildlife, the Department of Food and Agriculture, the Department of Health Services, the Department of Pesticide Regulation, the Department of Public Health, the Board of Forestry and Fire Protection and the Water Resources Board) and overseen by the newly created Bureau of Medical cannabis Regulation under the Department of Consumer Affairs. It currently appears that the MMP's exemption for collective cultivation will expire on January1, 2019.

MCRSA creates a highly regulated, closed market which separately licenses cultivation, manufacture, inspection, distribution, transportation and sale of medical cannabis and medical cannabis products and requires licensees to engage in medical cannabis transactions only with contract only with other licensees. There are 17 separate licenses – 10 for cultivation, 2 for manufacturing, 2 for dispensaries and 1 each for testing, transportation and distribution. Restrictions on holding multiple licenses are designed to prevent industry concentration and vertical integration.

The Department of Food and Agriculture will issue licenses in four categories: Type 1 allows "specialty" cultivation of up to 5000 square feet of canopy size and "cottage" cultivation of up to 2500 square feet of canopy size; Type 2 allows "small" cultivation of up to 10,000 square feet of canopy size; Type 3 allows outdoor cultivation of up to one acre and indoor cultivation of up to 22,000 square feet of canopy size. The number of Type 3 licenses is to be "limited."


The Department of Agriculture will oversee a "track and trace" program covering all cannabis plants as well as medical cannabis and cannabis products from the nursery to the consumer. While cannabis plants in a non-flowering state may be transported by a nursery, all medical cannabis and medical cannabis products must be transported by a licensed transporter. Holders of cultivation and manufacturing licenses must send all medical cannabis and medical cannabis products to a licensed distributor who is required to first inspect the product for identity and quantity and then send a random sample to a licensed laboratory which will test medical cannabis for pesticides, molds and other contaminants and medical cannabis products for concentration and purity. After testing, the licensed laboratory issues a certificate of analysis that the product is fit for consumption or manufacture, as the case may be. Medical cannabis and MCPs must then be subjected to a quality assurance review to ensure "quality and content" and issued a "unique product identifier" before it is packaged, sealed and delivered to a licensee. While the distributor must be involved in the distribution process as described above, MCRSA permits licensed cultivators, manufacturers and dispensaries to negotiate price and terms directly, with the distributor being paid a fee for its services.

The following diagram depicts the flow of cannabis, medical cannabis and medical cannabis products from producer to consumer under MCRSA. Dotted lines represent

transactions negotiated between licensed purchasers and sellers in which the distributor is paid a fee for the services which it performs.




AUMA

Proposition 64 on the November 2016 ballot entitled "The Adult Use of Marijuana Act" ("AUMA") legalizes personal possession and cultivation of marijuana by adults for recreational use and also creates the framework for a commercial marijuana industry. For the most part AUMA incorporates and expands MCRSA. It adopts the same licensing structure, but adds

certain license classes – most notably and integrated "microbusiness" license allowing cultivation, manufacture, retail sales and, where permitted by local law, "on sale" premises where marijuana products can be consumed. It also creates an additional class of cultivation license permitting indoor and mixed light cultivation in excess of 22,000 square feet and outdoor cultivation in excess of one acre. While the licensing structure is similar, AUMA does not have the same prohibitions on holding licenses in different classes, although it does have other provisions which are designed to enhance competition by incorporating anti-trust concepts, including prohibitions on price-discrimination. Key provisions of MCRSA and AUMA are summarized and compared in Appendix 1.

The passage of AUMA will create a market structure very similar to that created by MCRSA:




