SUBJECT: Resolution approving execution of the renewal Standard Agreement

Number 17-94146 between the County and the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) for Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant (SABG) funding for the term of July 1, 2017

through June 30, 2020 in the maximum amount of \$2,113,050.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution.

FUNDING: This Agreement provides for Federal SABG funding not to exceed \$704,350 each fiscal year. Funding was anticipated in the Department's FY 2017/18 budget and there are no county general fund dollars required in this Agreement.

BACKGROUND:

The California Department of Health Care Services contracts with counties for the provision of alcohol and other drug prevention, treatment and recovery support services. A three year Agreement is used for the purpose of identifying and providing for substance use treatment and prevention in the County's service area. The Agreement allocates SABG funding for planning, carrying out, and evaluation activities to prevent and treat substance abuse.

The funding received from this Agreement is used to support in-house staff/services and a wide array of contracted services to best meet the prevention and treatment needs of residents. Services provided include substance abuse assessments, primary and secondary prevention, non-residential treatment including (outpatient and aftercare), residential treatment services and outpatient perinatal treatment programs, and to provide residents with information, resources and referrals.

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached agreement as it makes available continuation of essential program funding for alcohol/drug dependency treatment and preventive services for county residents.
