

**NEVADA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
IS SEEKING INTERESTED PERSONS TO SERVE ON THE FOLLOWING:**

***ADULT AND FAMILY SERVICES COMMISSION:** (5 vacancies) One Public Sector position to fill an unexpired 2-year term ending April 30, 2019, one Public Sector position to fill a 2-year term ending April 30, 2020, one Private Sector position to fill a 2-year unexpired term ending April 30, 2019 and two Private Sector positions to fill 2-year terms ending April 30, 2020. This Commission shall operate under the Nevada County Board of Supervisors as the primary advisory body relative to health and human service's needs, and performs the responsibilities of the Board of Directors as described under Title 42 USC Chapter 106 § 9910 - Tripartite Boards. ***AGRICULTURAL ADVISORY COMMISSION:** (3 positions) One Cattle Industry representative to fill a 4-yr. term ending March 1, 2022; one Equine Industry representative to fill a 4-yr. term ending March 1, 2022; one Livestock Other Than Cattle and Equine Industry representative to fill a 4-yr. term January 1, 2022. The Commission shall advise the Board of Supervisors on matters concerning the agricultural resources of the County, develop a framework for cooperation among agencies and institutions, interest groups, individuals, public and private property owner, and all others for wise conservation and management of resources to benefit the County's agricultural assets, and maintain an active Agricultural Commission to advise the County on agricultural-related matters. ***ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD:** (1 vacancy) One Alternate member vacancy to fill a 1-year unexpired term ending September 30, 2018. Specific qualifications are required per Section 1624 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. The function of the Appeals Board is to determine the full value of property or to determine other matters of property tax assessment over which the Appeals Board has jurisdiction. The Board acts in a quasi-judicial capacity and renders its decision only on the basis of proper evidence presented at the hearing. The functions of the Board are outlined in Section 1620 et seq. of the Revenue and Taxation Code. Compensated per Administrative Code Chapter II, Article 13.11. ***FISH AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION:** (3 vacancies) One Eastern Nevada County representative to fill a four year unexpired term ending January 31, 2022; one District III representative, and one District IV representative, District positions are appointed by the Board and serve at the pleasure of the District Supervisor. This Commission shall advise the Board of Supervisors on matters concerning the fish and wildlife resources of Nevada County, develop a framework for cooperation for wise utilization, conservation, research, education and management to benefit the County's fish and wildlife assets, and maintain an active wildlife committee to advise the County on wildlife-related matters and assist in the allocation of State Department of Fish and Game funds. ***HISTORICAL LANDMARKS COMMISSION:** (1 vacancy) One District II registered voter to be appointed by the District II supervisor. The purpose of this commission shall be to promote the general welfare of Nevada County and its citizens through official recognition, recording, marking, preserving, and promoting the historical resources of Nevada County. ***KINGSBURY GREENS COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT:** (1 vacancy) One resident of Kingsbury Greens CSD to fill an unexpired term ending December 4, 2020. MENTAL HEALTH ADVISORY BOARD: (1 vacancy) One Eastern Nevada County (District V) representative for an unexpired 3-year term ending June 30, 2018. This Board reviews and evaluates the community's mental health needs, services, facilities, and special problems; reviews any County agreements entered into pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5650; advises as to any aspect of the local mental health program; reviews and approves the procedures used to ensure citizen and professional involvement at all stages of the planning process; and submits an annual report to the Board of Supervisors. NEVADA COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT NO. 1 ADVISORY COMMITTEE: (7 vacancies) One Lake of the Pines Zone 2 alternate, one North San Juan Zone 4 representative and one Gold Creek Zone 5 representative, all to fill 2-yr. unexpired terms ending June 30, 2018. One Lake Wildwood Zone 1 alternate, one Cascade Shores Zone 8 representative, one Cascade Shores Zone 8 alternate, and one Eden Ranch Zone 9 representative to fill 2-yr. unexpired terms ending June 30, 2019. Members shall be property owner representatives. The Board of Directors of the Nevada County Sanitation District No. 1 appoints the members. This Committee provides assistance and information to the Board of Directors on matters relating to sewage collection and treatment facilities, including annual budget preparation. ***SEWAGE DISPOSAL TECHNICAL ADVISORY GROUP:** (5 vacancies) One consultant appointed by District I Supervisor, one consultant appointed by District II Supervisor, one consultant appointed by District IV Supervisor, and one consultant appointed by District V Supervisor, each selected from the County-at-large to serve at the pleasure of the appointing Supervisor. One Realtor representative appointed by the Board of Supervisors to serve at the pleasure of the Board. Consultant is defined in County of Nevada On-Site Sewage Disposal Ordinance 1975 as one of the following: Certified Engineering Geologist, Certified Professional Soil Scientist, Registered Civil Engineer, Registered Environmental Health Specialist, or Registered Geologist. Said group members may not be employees of the County of Nevada. Each group member will be qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to sewage disposal. The purpose will be to review and recommend proposed revisions and additions to the sewage disposal regulations or sewage disposal ordinance in an advisory capacity; review and recommend new methods, techniques, and materials for on-site sewage disposal, in an advisory capacity; and serve as an appeal body under the provisions of Section A-032 of County Resolution 98-217. ***SOLID AND HAZARDOUS WASTE COMMISSION (NEVADA COUNTY):** (1 vacancy) One local Business representative to fill a two year term ending January 31, 2020. This Commission will assist the County in the development of a comprehensive long-range plan for the disposal and recycling of solid and hazardous waste within the County, and the management of the County's solid waste operations, including all of the financial matters pertaining thereto. ***TRANSIT SERVICES COMMISSION:** (2 Positions) Two public member positions available March 31, 2014. This commission shall a) establish fares; b) adopt the level of transit and paratransit services, including route structure and service areas; c) monitor public response; d) approve proposed purchase of additional vehicles; e) oversee on a regular basis and advise as necessary on the daily operations of the system; f) review and approve the annual budget for transit and paratransit operations; g) approve applying for grants for usual operation and /or for demonstration or study projects; h) direct staff to perform studies and analysis to evaluate options and alternative for providing transit and paratransit services on a short term and long term basis and report back to the Transit Commission; i) approve adjustments in the program in order to serve the public with maximum efficiency and services, including contracting with others for a portion of, or all of, transit, paratransit and ancillary services.
