OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE COOPERATIVE SERVICE AGREEMENT NO. 18-73-06-0265-RA BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF NEVADA AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, ANIMAL AND PLANT HEALTH INSPECTION SERVICE-WILDLIFE SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018/19 THROUGH FISCAL YEAR 2022/23, AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT, AND APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD TO EXECUTE THE ANNUAL FINANCIAL PLAN BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF NEVADA AND UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, ANIMAL AND PLANT HEALTH INSPECTION SERVICE-WILDLIFE SERVICES

WHEREAS, a United States Department of Agriculture Wildlife Damage Management Program has been in existence in the County of Nevada as far back as 1924; and

WHEREAS, this program provides protection, through technical assistance, of natural resources, livestock, crops, property and private citizens, within the County of Nevada, from predators and other nuisance wildlife; and

WHEREAS, the performance of wildlife damage management actions by the Wildlife Services under this agreement is contingent upon a determination by Wildlife Services that such actions are in compliance with the Endangered Species Act and all applicable environmental statutes; and

WHEREAS, funding will come from 0101 20601 301 1000/521520.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada that:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are adopted as findings of the Board of Supervisors as set forth fully herein.
- 2. The Board of Supervisors approves Cooperative Service Agreement Number 18-73-06-0265-RA between the County of Nevada and United States Department of Agriculture Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service-Wildlife Services for Fiscal Year 2018/19 through Fiscal Year 2022/23, effective July 1, 2018, and authorizes the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to Execute the Agreement.

- 3. The Board of Supervisors approves and authorizes the Chair to execute the Financial Plan between the County of Nevada and United States Department of Agriculture Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service-Wildlife Services as follows:
 - a. Fiscal Year 2018/19 \$65,216.00
 - b. Fiscal Year 2019/20 \$67,172.00

 - c. Fiscal Year 2020/21 \$69,188.00d. Fiscal Year 2021/22 \$71,263.00
 - e. Fiscal Year 2022/23 \$73,400.00
- 4. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds and determines that approval of this Resolution is pursuant to the attached California Environmental Quality Act document.
- 5. The Agricultural Commissioner is hereby directed to file the attached CEQA document with the County Clerk of the County of Nevada within twenty-four (24) hours after the adoption of this Resolution.
- 6. The County Clerk is hereby directed upon receipt of attached CEQA document, to post the attached document according to CEQA Guideline §15062.
