



RESOLUTION No. 18-207

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION APPROVING A REVISED FEE FOR PROVIDING GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS SERVICES AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION 11-073

WHEREAS, Nevada County Geographic Information System (GIS) contains data that is useful to the public; and

WHEREAS, Section A-II 24.18 of the Nevada County Administrative Code provides that the Board of Supervisors shall adopt by resolution a schedule of fees for maps, data, analyses, reports and related information services and/or use of the Geographic Information System; and

WHEREAS, Board of Supervisors last established such fees by Resolution 11-073; and

WHEREAS, the cost of providing such products and services, as well as the manner in which such products and services are provided, have increased since the adoption of said Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada that:

1. The hourly fee for Geographic Information System discretionary non-contracted services provided to the public and external organizations shall be \$122 per hour. Said fee shall be billable in quarter-hour increments.
2. Said fee shall be charged to members of the public and external organizations for Geographic Information System services, including but not limited to:
 - Analysis using various GIS map and data layers;
 - Input data from tables or existing maps;
 - Relate new data to county data already in the system;
 - Provide lists of selected public information such as parcel records with APN;
 - Produce written reports; and
 - Produce electronic files.
3. Resolution 11-073 is hereby rescinded in its entirety.
