SUBJECT: Resolution approving a Agreement with the City of Grass Valley for AB109 police officer services for the fiscal year 2017-2018 and approving a budget amendment (4/5 affirmative vote required).

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the Resolution.

FUNDING: The Agreement amount of \$45,000 for fiscal year 2017-2018, is 100% funded by State Local Community Corrections Account apportionment (AB109). Funding was approved in the Community Corrections Partnership Plan (Res. 17-499) for FY 2017/18 and a budget amendment is required. No general funds are required.

BACKGROUND:

Since the inception of AB109 in 2011, Nevada County Probation has successfully developed multiple programs and resources within the community to address the needs of probationers released from, or eligible for, State prison sentences. Nevada County is very fortunate to have a tradition of excellent collaboration among the Courts, Probation, Sheriff, Police Departments, District Attorney, Public Defender, Health and Human Services, Community Based Organizations and the faith-based community. Members of the Nevada County Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) are committed to working closely together to assess, implement, maintain, refine and increase services funded by AB109.

For FY 2017/2018 the Community Corrections Partnership Executive Committee agreed the City of Grass Valley may receive a distribution of Nevada County AB109 Realignment funds in the maximum amount of \$45,000 for AB109 police officer services. This Agreement will allow for the funding of a uniformed police officer to work alongside probation officers to further AB109 initiatives. The inclusion of a visible, active law enforcement officer working alongside probation officers on AB109 related activities ensures a higher level of public safety and is a prime example of the collaborative efforts amongst Nevada County's criminal justice partners. While the services included in this Agreement were agreed upon at the inception, meeting the legal contract requirements of each jurisdiction took longer to finalize than anticipated, thus the delay in bringing this Agreement to the Board of Supervisors.
