



	Begin Development of a Formal Organizational Development Program County Executive Office	The CEO, Assistant CEO and HR Director have begun research into how to best embark on a formal organizational development program. Research included a site visit to Marin County, four staff completing Lean training, identification of and preliminary conversations with potential professional consultants. In addition, the Employee Survey Results were shared with all County staff on May 25th and follow up action items have been started.
	Control staffing levels and County costs by reviewing all requests for staffing changes and vacancies for revenue availability and staffing alternatives.  County Executive Office	Between January 1 and June 7th, 137 vacancy review requests have been submitted for approval. For each vacancy, the department is asked to analyze if the position is still needed, if the duties could be filled in another way, and what would happen if the position was not refilled. In addition, departments assess whether the current job classification is still the most appropriate or if the FTE should be reclassified to perform different work, to fill the department's business

needs.

## Wildfire Preparedness, cont.

- Ponderosa Fuel Break
- Green waste event removed one million pounds of fuel from residential properties
- Applied for over \$16M from CalFIRE and FEMA
- Partnered with NCCFD for defensible space inspections
- Convened 35 partner agencies to improve coordination
- ReadyNevadaCounty campaign







## Address Homelessness

**BOS Objective:** Implement a Homeless Services Plan utilizing Coordinated Entry, a 24/7 service pilot program and a housing first model to identify and offer services to the most vulnerable homeless population in Nevada County through partnerships with other jurisdictions, law enforcement and community providers.



### Address Homelessness, cont.



- Highlights: Increase coordination with the jail regarding connecting homeless individuals to community based services upon release.
  - Monthly Stepping Up initiative meetings
  - First quarterly public Stepping Up meeting was held
  - Universal Health Screenings implemented in jail
  - Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) collaborative
  - Additional therapist and SUD counselor
  - DOJ funding application to expand diversion for mentally ill
