OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 3 (MODIFICATION NO. 006) TO THE COOPERATIVE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGREEMENT NO. 17-LE-1105-1360-018 BETWEEN THE NEVADA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND THE USDA FOREST SERVICE, TAHOE NATIONAL FOREST ADOPTING THE 2019 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE ANNUAL OPERATING AND FINANCIAL PLAN

WHEREAS, Resolution 17-154 authorized the execution of a Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement ("Agreement") No. 17-LE-1105-1360-05 with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, Tahoe National Forest pertaining to law enforcement services provided by the Sheriff's Office on National Forest Service lands; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement requires an Annual Operating and Financial Plan for each federal fiscal year of the Agreement; and


WHEREAS, Resolution 18-153 authorized an amendment to the Agreement by replacing Exhibits A and B, establishing a negotiated operating cost for law enforcement services in the amount of \$24,000, for the operational period October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 19-207 authorized a second amendment to the Agreement by replacing Exhibit A, establishing a negotiated operating cost for law enforcement services in the amount of \$12,000, for Campground Patrol for the operational period October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into a third amendment to the Agreement to replace Exhibit B to continue providing controlled substance law enforcement services, and establish a negotiated operating cost in the amount not to exceed \$12,000, for controlled substance enforcement for the operational period October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors, of the County of Nevada, State of California, that the Chair of the Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of the Nevada County Sheriff's Office, that Amendment No. 3 (Modification No. 006) to the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement No. 17-LE-1105-1360-018 pertaining to controlled substance enforcement services on National Forest Service lands, for the period beginning October 1, 2018 and ending September 30, 2019, in the amount not to exceed \$12,000 as detailed in the new Exhibit B.

AMENDMENT #3 TO CONTRACT WITH

United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, Tahoe National Forest

THIS AMENDMENT is executed this 13th day of August, 2019 by and between United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, Tahoe National Forest and the Nevada County Sheriff's Office Said Amendment (modification No. 006) will amend the prior Agreement No. 17-LE-1105-1360-018 between the parties entitled Cooperative Law Enforcement Annual Operating Plan and Financial Plan executed on the 11th day of April, 2017 by Resolution No. 17-154, and which Agreement was subsequently amended on the 24th day of April, 2018 by Resolution No. 18-153, and on the 28th day of May, 2019 by Resolution No. 19-207.

WHEREAS, the parties desire for the Nevada County Sheriff's Office to continue providing law enforcement services in the Tahoe National Forest; and

WHEREAS, the parties are required to negotiate an operating plan for each year during the term of the Agreement to establish the annual cost for providing services; and

WHEREAS, the negotiated cost to be billed by the County of Nevada for the services provided by the Agreement shall not exceed \$12,000 for FY 2019; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. This amendment shall be effective as of August 13, 2019.
- 2. That the 2018 Controlled Substance Annual Operating and Financial Plan. Exhibit 'B' shall be amended by replacing it with the 2019 Controlled Substance Annual Operating and Financial Plan in the attached Exhibit 'B'.
- 3. That in all other respects the prior agreement of the parties shall remain in full force and effect except as amended herein.

II. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OPERATIONS

Pursuant to IV- J of Agreement No. 17-LE-11051360-018, the following is in support of operations to suppress manufacturing and trafficking of controlled substances on or affecting the administration of National Forest System lands, with an emphasis on identification, apprehension and prosecution of suspects engaged in these activities:



A. The U.S. Forest Service agrees:

- 1. To reimburse <u>NCSO</u> for expenditures associated with the detection of locations and activities related to illegal production and trafficking of controlled substances, including;
 - a. Ground reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - b. Aerial reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- 2. To reimburse <u>NCSO</u> for certain expenses resulting from investigative activities associated with investigating cases involving the illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances on or affecting the administration of National Forest System lands, including:
 - a. Surveillance operations to identify persons illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - b. Apprehension of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - c. Collection of evidence to support prosecution of persons suspected of illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - d. Prosecution of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- 3. To reimburse <u>NCSO</u> for expenses resulting from the removal of cannabis plants from National Forest System lands. When circumstances indicate that removal of the cannabis plants is required before an investigation to determine the person(s) responsible can be completed, eradication operations must be approved by the U.S. Forest Service prior to taking place.
 - **Note:** <u>NCSO</u> retains the authority to eradicate cannabis plants from National Forest System lands without reimbursement from the U.S. Forest Service at its discretion.
- 4. To reimburse <u>NCSO</u> for the costs of purchasing supplies and equipment used exclusively for activities described in items A.1, A.2 and A.3 of this Plan. Purchases must be agreed to and approved by the U.S. Forest Service.

Purchases may **not exceed 10% of the total allocation** without prior approval by the U.S. Forest Service Designated Representative.



B. NCSO agrees:

- 1. Within its capability, to perform the following activities on National Forest System lands:
 - a. Detect and inventory locations associated with illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances, and notify the U.S. Forest Service of such locations as soon as possible.
 - b. Investigations to determine the person(s) responsible for manufacturing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - c. Upon request and prior approval of the U.S. Forest Service, remove cannabis plants from National Forest System lands.
- 2. To furnish all activity reports, crime reports, investigation reports, and other reports or records, resulting from activities identified in **Section II**, **A** of this Operating and Financial Plan to the affected Forests for review and forwarding to the Regional Office for processing.
- C. The *U.S. Forest Service* and **NCSO** mutually agree to the following:
 - 1. The following rate schedule will apply to all expenditures that may be reimbursed to **NCSO** under this agreement;

- 2. The total expenditures of <u>NCSO</u> that may be reimbursed may not exceed.... \$12,000. The total expenditures for item A.4 may not exceed..... 10% of the total allocation.
- D. Any remaining funding in this Annual Operating Plan may be carried forward to the next fiscal year and will be available to spend through the term of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement, or de-obligated at the request of the U.S. Forest Service.
