Food insecurity: Elderly

- Food insecurity among seniors continues to increase across local communities in the USA
- Nevada County ranks 4th largest senior population in CA per capita
 - 2.1% increase in 2018
- 10,000 people a day are turning 65
 - ► Trend will continue through 2050
- By 2033, seniors will outnumber children for the first time in the US
- World, Federal and State agencies are working on aging issues

Meals on Wheels Program:

- Eligibility:
 - Must be over 60 years old
 - Must be frail (physically or mentally)
 - Must be medically homebound
 - Must not have support (paid or family)



- ▶ 1 meal delivered to their home by volunteers: 58,000 miles/year
- Average age 75 years old
- ▶ 95% Fall risk
- ▶ 87% have at least 2 chronic disabling conditions
- 30% Veterans
- > 75% low income
- ▶ 67% of clients have not celebrated their Bday in 5 years
- ▶ 65% of clients listed the agency as their emergency contact
- All clients receive case management and referrals at home



Lunch Café Program:

- In-kind kitchen and dining room at the Nevada City Apartments
- Donation-based hot meal provided Monday-Friday
- Classes and Activities:

Bingo Nutrition Education

Pinnacle Socialization

- Blood pressure checks
- ► HICAP assistance
- Community referrals



Clients:

- Average age 70 years old
- ▶ 60% Fall risk
- ▶ 15% Veterans
- ▶ 90% low income
- Only hot meal for the day for the majority of seniors




Why are the elderly an urgent need in Nevada County?

 - Rough & Ready
 - Nevada City
 - North San Juan
- Malnutrition in current Meals on Wheels clients
- No Senior Center to assist the elderly
