SUBJECT: **Resolution to Award Contract for the 2019 McCourtney Road Landfill West Ditch Drainage Improvements to Southwest General Engineering, Inc., for a total amount not to exceed \$58,014.00 and Rescind Resolution 19-632**

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached Resolution

FUNDING: This contract impacts the Fiscal Year 2019/20 Solid Waste Western Budgets. There is no impact to the General Fund.

BACKGROUND: On September 24, 2019, the Nevada County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 19-526 that approved the plans, specifications and cost estimate for the subject project and instructed the Nevada County Purchasing Division to advertise for bids. The bid was advertised in accordance with the Public Contract Code and posted on the County's ePurchasing website and bid notifications were emailed to appropriate firms. The bids were opened on October 25, 2019, and are listed below:

On December 17th, 2019, per Resolution 19-632, the Board of Supervisors awarded to the low bidder, Edward T. Navickis. On December 20, 2019, Mr. Navickis requested to withdraw his bid. Accordingly, it is recommended that the contract be awarded to the 2nd low bidder, Southwest General Engineering, Inc. at the bid price of \$52,740.00, plus a 10% contingency of \$5,274.00, for a total of \$58,014.00.

This project includes preparation for and construction of 500 feet of shallow concrete V-ditch in an existing roadside drainage swale. Once the drainage is properly lined water will flow into the storm water collection system and safely leave the site. Work is scheduled to begin in February of 2020, and be completed within 10 working days, as allowed for in the contract.
