## OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

*No Roosters / Guinea Hens / Other exotic varieties that are noisy
*Egg Production only
*Domestic use only, Commercial sales not allowed
*Single family dwelling with a fenced rear yard
*Shelter requirements- Must be kept in secured coop or pen to protect from predators
FFeed Storage- Stored within enclosed container to prevent the attraction of vermin
*Manure Management- Manure produced from chickens managed in a manner that prevents odors, flies, and pests.
