



Current Numbers

- Laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Nevada County: 39
 - This number does not necessarily represent the total number of cases of COVID-19 in Nevada County.
- Number released from isolation based on current CDC criteria: 36
 - This does not necessarily represent an accurate absence of disease in the population.
- Number of deaths due to COVID-19: 1
- Number of COVID-19 tests conducted on Nevada County residents: 1,190
 - This number does necessarily reflect all who were tested.

Amended Stay-at-Home Order

Allows for expanded opportunities for outdoor recreation, if done safely and with modifications Provides guidance for safe practices for some activities and services, such as construction

Responded to constructive feedback from local Law Enforcement

Reopening **Roadmap:** California's 6 Indicators for Modifying the Stay-at-Home Order

- 1. The ability to monitor and protect our communities through testing, contact tracing, isolating, and supporting those who are positive or exposed.
- 2. The ability to prevent infection in people who are at risk for more severe COVID-19.
- 3. The ability of the hospital and health systems to handle surges.
- 4. The ability to develop therapeutics to meet the demand.
- 5. The ability for businesses, schools, and child care facilities to support physical distancing.
- 6. The ability to determine when to reinstitute certain measures, such as the stay-at-home orders, if necessary.

Reopening Advisory Committee

The purpose of this Committee is twofold:

- to provide advice, input and recommendations to the Public Health Officer on implementing any decision by the Governor to modify the Stay-at-Home Order, and
- to provide guidance and resources to local businesses to assist them in preparing to reopen, once allowed, with modified public health and safety measures in place.
