Dear Supervisors,

I am writing to oppose item 26 on the agenda, the Emergency Ordinance. In this note I will focus on only a couple of the many reasons this is an unnecessary and overly oppressive measure.

First, **there is no emergency** because at this time there are no businesses in violation of COVID-19 Orders in our county. The county has already assessed \$1,000 per day fines without this new ordinance, which is already an overly oppressive amount for businesses with small profit margins in this COVID environment. No additional fines or massive expansion of enforcement is needed.

Second, there has been considerable confusion and mis-information about the effectiveness of loose-fitting cotton or paper masks. The "experts" have flip-flopped on this matter and there is no consensus on their effectiveness. While "health experts" flip flop in accordance with political pressures, the fact is that cotton or paper surgical masks are not effective in controlling a virus. These masks cannot stop a virus as the virus particle size is small enough to fit through the holes in the fabric or simply escape via the open edges of such loosely-worn masks, So, most of this draconian enforcement and paranoia is based on invalid science. Here are the facts:

A **report from the CDC** in May, 2020 evaluated different Personal Protective Measures (PPE) in limiting the spread of COVID. Hand hygiene was identified as effective, but regarding disposable medical masks and cotton masks it concludes "there is limited evidence for their effectiveness in preventing influenza virus transmission either when worn by the infected person for source control or when worn by uninfected persons to reduce exposure." https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/eid/article/26/5/19-0994_article

An article published in the **New England Journal of Medicine** on April 1, 2020 on the topic of COVID-19 stated that "We know that wearing a mask outside health care facilities offers little, if any protection from infection." And goes on to say "the desire for widespread masking is a reflexive reaction to anxiety over the pandemic." The article was subsequently amended on June 3, 2020 to include the statement "We strongly support the calls of public health agencies for all people to wear masks when circumstances compel them to be within 6 ft. of others for sustained periods." Thus, spacing OR masking is adequate while neither is necessary for short interactions. https://www.nejm.org/doi/full/10.1056/NEJMp2006372

There is significant controversy among health experts around the world on the effectiveness of masks. Many European countries do not require masks, and their death rates are low. Refer to this article for some perspective: https://fee.org/articles/europes-top-health-officials-say-masks-arent-helpful-in-beating-covid-19/

Dine-in restaurants have reduced the seating capacity to create safe spacing between tables and diners not in one party. Based on the above journal report, that spacing is adequate protection without the need for continuous masking while dining-in.

Few people practice correct procedures in wearing or putting on or taking off masks. They can thus increase their risk of infection.

Continuously wearing masks for long periods of time impairs the body's ability to flush away bacteria and CO2. Some of our local waitresses, who have worn masks for a full shift, have had their lungs become infected with their own bacteria by not flushing out of their airways. I personally know of a Nevada County teenager who's doctor advised against long-term wearing of masks when she became infected this way.

It is time to treat our citizens as adults. If someone does not want to be exposed to others at a dine-in restaurant, no one is forcing them to do so. If they prefer an outdoor restaurant, there are (at least for two more months) plenty of choices. If a person wants to dine-in, then they are doing so with full knowledge of the (small) risk of doing so. Our intensive care facilities are not even close to capacity. There is no emergency.

The Governor's order to wear masks in all businesses has already activated the "Face Mask Fascists" in Nevada County to spy on and report businesses if an employee has to temporarily "come up for air" from continuously wearing the suffocating masks. Even if the employees are practicing safe distancing. One of our Supervisors has on social media whipped up these Fascists to report to the county so enforcement officers can go out and inspect, issue citations and fines, and this is directed at all businesses, not just for restaurants—a bank was targeted! That is despicable and like the Gestapo or Stassi secret police.

Some of our businesses have been physically attacked and vandalized already by vigilantes who are empowered by the draconian measures being taken by our county and believe they have the right to take matters into their own hands. Passage of this Ordinance will make this issue worse. We are now a lawless society, enabled and encouraged by our County's staff and Supervisors. Time to stop the hate!

I write you to express my concern about the proposed Covid-19 Emergency legislation and your lack of providing adequate and acceptable means to provide public input and commentary. Your role as a Supervisor is to represent the public, not to dictate to your constituency. If you want adult behavior, treat your constituents like adults. The Covid-19 issue is fraught and riddled with contradictions, inaccuracies, and poor communication. It is impossible to regulate or protect the public from themselves. You need to recognize that and allow the public to make decisions regarding how to respond to the Covid-19 risks without legislating it. The proposed penalty structure is excessive and unreasonable.

No one is forced to go to a restaurant. No one is forced to go to a barber. No one is forced to attend church or a social club meeting. We go freely, and should not be impeded or prevented directly or indirectly by regulatory action. More than enough "communication" is thrown at us every day by the media and government to understand there may be some degree of risk, and that we can and should take steps to minimize that risk. We can stay home; we can wash our hands; we can wear a mask; we can distance ourselves from others. Social distancing requirements are clear, and we each have accountability for assuring that is practiced. If you think the proposed measures are needed, you have simply over-looked the fact that Nevada County has very low incidence rates and we, your constituency, have clearly demonstrated an ability to successfully and effectively respond to this issue. The County has experienced only one death attributed to Covid-19 and the Confirmed Case load does not reflect severity, but rather presence of detectable infection, which may be asymptomatic and/or of minimal consequence.

We have entered an era of uncontrolled hypocrisy. The government allows rioters and looters and protestors to assemble without any regard to the Covid-19 risks, yet you are wanting to control citizens from engaging in truly peaceful, legal activities such as dining out. Hardware stores, retail stores, pharmacies, grocery stores, gas stations, post offices, etc. can be entered and occupied with distancing and masks, but restaurants cannot? Hello.

I have heard that you want to fine businesses or citizens that are exercising their rights in Nevada County, because they are not wearing masks. Are you aware that there is NO law or executive order that says we have to wear masks? I also saw a video recently where Gov. Newsome stated that he can't actually mandate anything, and he would be correct. What you are considering is illegal and unconstitutional.

Plus, there is the science that says masks don't really help, but that they do negatively affect the people wearing them, reducing their oxygen, which is vital for good health. According to the OSHA Director of Enforcement Programs, Richard E. Fairfax, air below 19.5% is considered oxygen-deficient. OSHA (https://www.osha.gov/laws-regs/standardinterpretations/2007-04-02-0), Richard E. Fairfax, Director of Enforcement Programs states in his letter dated April 7, 2007,

"Paragraph (d)(2)(iii) of the Respiratory Protection Standard considers any atmosphere with an oxygen level below 19.5 percent to be oxygen-deficient and immediately dangerous to life or health...

Human beings must breathe oxygen . . . to survive, and begin to suffer adverse health effects when the oxygen level of their breathing air drops below [19.5 percent oxygen]. Below 19.5 percent oxygen . . . , air is considered oxygen-deficient. At concentrations of 16 to 19.5 percent, workers engaged in any form of exertion can rapidly become symptomatic as their tissues fail to obtain the oxygen necessary to function properly (Rom, W., Environmental and Occupational Medicine, 2nd ed.; Little, Brown; Boston, 1992). Increased breathing rates, accelerated heartbeat, and impaired thinking or coordination occur more quickly in an oxygen-deficient environment. Even a momentary loss of coordination may be devastating to a worker if it occurs while the worker is performing a potentially dangerous activity, such as climbing a ladder. Concentrations of 12 to 16 percent oxygen cause tachypnea (increased breathing rates), tachycardia (accelerated heartbeat), and impaired attention, thinking, and coordination (e.g., Ex. 25-4), even in people who are resting.

At oxygen levels of 10 to 14 percent, faulty judgment, intermittent respiration, and exhaustion can be expected even with minimal exertion (Exs. 25-4 and 150). Breathing air containing 6 to 10 percent oxygen results in nausea, vomiting, lethargic movements, and perhaps unconsciousness. Breathing air containing less than 6 percent oxygen produces convulsions, then apnea (cessation of breathing), followed by cardiac standstill. These symptoms occur immediately. Even if a worker survives the hypoxic insult, organs may show evidence of hypoxic damage, which may be irreversible (Exs. 25-4 and 150; also reported in Rom, W. [see reference in previous paragraph])."

SUBJECT:

Balancing Public Safety with the Preservation of Civil Rights

The current national crisis related to COVID-19 has required the imposition of extraordinary restrictions on all of our daily lives. Millions of Americans across the nation have been ordered to stay in their homes, leaving only for essential and necessary reasons, while countless businesses and other gathering places have been ordered to close their doors indefinitely. These kinds of restrictions have been necessary in order to stop the spread of a deadly disease—but there is no denying that they have imposed tremendous burdens on the daily lives of all Americans.

In prior Memoranda, I directed our prosecutors to prioritize cases against those seeking to illicitly profit from the pandemic, either by hoarding scarce medical resources to sell them for extortionate prices, or by defrauding people who are already in dire circumstances due to the severe problems the pandemic has caused. We have pursued those efforts vigorously and will continue to do so. Now, I am directing each of our United States Attorneys to also be on the lookout for state and local directives that could be violating the constitutional rights and civil liberties of individual citizens.

As the Department of Justice explained recently in guidance to states and localities taking steps to battle the pandemic, even in times of emergency, when reasonable and temporary restrictions are placed on rights, the First Amendment and federal statutory law prohibit discrimination against religious institutions and religious believers. The legal restrictions on state and local authority are not limited to discrimination against religious institutions and religious believers. For example, the Constitution also forbids, in certain circumstances, discrimination against disfavored speech and undue interference with the national economy. If a state or local ordinance crosses the line from an appropriate exercise of authority to stop the spread of COVID-19 into an overbearing infringement of constitutional and statutory protections, the Department of Justice may have an obligation to address that overreach in federal court.

I am therefore directing the Assistant Attorney General for Civil Rights, Eric Dreiband, and Matthew Schneider, the U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Michigan, to oversee and coordinate our efforts to monitor state and local policies and, if necessary, take action to correct them. They should work not only with all Department of Justice offices and other federal agencies, but with state and local officials as well.

Many policies that would be unthinkable in regular times have become commonplace in recent weeks, and we do not want to unduly interfere with the important efforts of state and local officials to protect the public. But the Constitution is not suspended in times of crisis. We must therefore be vigilant to ensure its protections are preserved, at the same time that the public is protected.

I thank you for your attention to this important initiative and for your service to our country.

We have been following the public discussions about restaurants, like Friar Tucks and Sergios, violating county ordinances in regards to operations during COVID. We have several thoughts to share:

- 1. As a physician, I have absolutely no doubt that the pandemic is real, that people who assemble in public places (or at friends) without distancing/etc. ARE agents in spreading the disease. I don't get my news from TV or newspapers. I read medical journals and other publications. I commend the efforts of our County Public Health Department's to put out accurate information. (Dr George Scarmon)
- 2. This is part of a much bigger issue. As residents, our hearts ache for businesses, particularly restaurants, that have been so hard hit by COVID. In the big picture, we are extremely worried about the damage to our already struggling economy. We rely on tourism to fuel our economy; visitors and residents alike must be able to come to a safe environment. This problem has to be solved. Looking ahead, we will need our restaurants safely open if the arts (which drive tourism) are ever to begin operating again, since you know our arts heavily rely on restaurants, lodging and more in our community to be successful. This is all tied together!
- 3. We urge the county to place the health and safety of ALL residents FIRST, especially the most vulnerable. Our civil liberties are the same as those protesting; none of us is better or more deserving than the other. A restaurant's rights to run its business efficiently doesn't supersede our rights to expect the restaurant to operate an environment that is safe for their customers and the community.

- 6. Save fines or closures for the most egregious violators after concurrence is reached. The last thing restaurants can afford right now are fines and fines don't solve the problems causing them to ignore existing ordinances. How can you get them to willingly comply?

54950. It is the intent of the law that their actions be taken openly and that their deliberations be conducted openly. **OPENLY!!** NOT ON ZOOM!

The people of this State do not yield their sovereignty to the agencies which serve them. The people, in delegating authority, do not give their public servants the right to decide what is good for the people to know and what is

not good for them to know. The people insist on remaining informed so that they may retain control over the instruments they have created.

DIVISION 1. PERSONS [38 - 86] (Heading of Division 1 amended by Stats. 1988, Ch. 160, Sec. 12.)

PART 2. PERSONAL RIGHTS [43 - 53.7]

(Part 2 enacted 1872.)

- 51.7. (a) This section shall be known, and may be cited, as the Ralph Civil Rights Act of 1976. (b) All persons within the jurisdiction of this state have the right to be free from any violence, or intimidation by threat of violence, committed against their persons or property because of political affiliation, or on account of any characteristic listed or defined in subdivision (b) or (e) of Section 51, or position in a labor dispute, or because another person perceives them to have one or more of those characteristics. The identification in this subdivision of particular bases of discrimination is illustrative rather than restrictive.
- (1) A person shall not require another person to waive any legal right, penalty, remedy, forum, or procedure for a violation of this section, as a condition of entering into a contract for goods or services, including the right to file and pursue a civil action or complaint with, or otherwise notify, the Attorney General or any other public prosecutor, or law enforcement agency, the Department of Fair Employment and Housing, or any court or other governmental entity.
- (2) A person shall not refuse to enter into a contract with, or refuse to provide goods or services to, another person on the basis that the other person refuses to waive any legal right, penalty, remedy, forum, or procedure for a violation of this section, including the right to file and pursue a civil action or complaint with, or otherwise notify, the Attorney General or any other public prosecutor, or law enforcement agency, the Department of Fair Employment and Housing, or any other governmental entity.
- (3) Any waiver of any legal right, penalty, remedy, forum, or procedure for a violation of this section, including the right to file and pursue a civil action or complaint with, or otherwise notify, the Attorney General or any other public prosecutor, or law enforcement agency, the Department of Fair Employment and Housing, or any other governmental entity shall be knowing and voluntary, in writing, and expressly not made as a condition of entering into a contract for goods or services or as a condition of providing or receiving goods and services.
- (4) Any waiver of any legal right, penalty, remedy, forum, or procedure for a violation of this section that is required as a condition of entering into a contract for goods or services shall be deemed involuntary, unconscionable, against public policy, and unenforceable. Nothing in this subdivision shall affect the enforceability or validity of any other provision of the contract.
- (5) Any person who seeks to enforce a waiver of any legal right, penalty, remedy, forum, or procedure for a violation of this section shall have the burden of proving that the waiver was knowing and voluntary and not made as a condition of the contract or of providing or receiving the goods or services.

We were very disappointed to learn that the ordinance increasing fines on businesses for COVID-19 violations was tabled until your next meeting. RE: Review of Eviction Moratorium Extension

While the Board of Directors of the Nevada County Association of REALTORS is empathic with the special circumstances and hardships of many tenants of residential and commercial properties at this unprecedented time, we are dually aware of the undue and onerous hardship placed upon landlords who need the rental income normally provided by their tenants in order to pay their mortgages, property taxes, maintenance and other expenses associated with property ownership.

It is the position of the governing body of the Nevada County Association of REALTORS that the Nevada County Board of Supervisors should <u>NOT</u> extend the eviction moratorium at this time due to

what we believe will be unintended consequences to property owners in our community – an increase in Foreclosures being the primary consequence. Foreclosure in any community causes property values to plummet, creates the potential for blight and can reduce the normal pride of ownership we enjoy in our community today. Foreclosure activity destabilizes the economy in any community and especially a small community such as Nevada County where many residents use rental property to provide a steady income, the ability to retire and wealth build.

The costs of property ownership have not declined since the pandemic began and for many tenants the temporary forbearance of rent afforded by the Cares Act will be a heavy burden once the temporary forbearance time frame is lifted, extending this will only further indebt tenants at a time when they should be working with their landlord to find a mutually satisfactory and agreeable solution. In turn, many property owners who have had to apply for forbearance on their mortgage due to the pandemic were, denied or notified that the deferred portion of their mortgage would be due and payable in one lump sum at the end of the forbearance period. Additionally, some property owners have reported that they have sustained credit damage for utilizing forbearance.

On behalf of the Nevada County Association of REALTORS® leadership, I urge the Nevada County Board of Supervisors to keep property rights and unintended consequences at the forefront of any decision regarding eviction moratoriums in our community.

"Any violation of any order issued by 1) the Governor, 2) the County Health Officer, 3) a Statewide public health directive, or 3) the County Environmental Health Department that exists now or in the future and is issued to limit the spread of COVID-19. Orders are: no dining in at restaurants, no dining outside without adequate distances, employees/staff with mask or social distancing, non-essential business (at the arbitrary and capricious whim of some unelected official).

Incorporation into County law. All Covid-19 Orders are incorporated into the Law of the County of Nevada. "

Even future orders, without review or approval by the Supervisors.) Some of these orders may be illegal, unenforceable or unconstitutional. This incorporation into County Law legitimizes what could be unenforceable/unconstitutional orders. **WOW just wow.**

Dear Supervisors Hall, Scofield, Miller, Hoek & Anderson:

I am writing to strongly oppose Item 26, the temporary Urgency Ordinance related to enforcement of COVID-related health department orders.

There are several grounds upon which this is at best a bad idea and at worst an unconstitutional power grab by the governor and health department, and thus by Nevada County.

- 1. The Governor's emergency power in March was triggered by a need to prevent overloading our urgent care capabilities. That risk has long passed, and under the CA Constitution the Governor's emergency power has ended. No such risk of overwhelming our care capacity currently exists. Accurate data support this conclusion.
- 2. As a result, the Governor's recent orders are illegal and unenforceable, as are the orders of our Health Department, which has no new emergency authority than the Governor's and which is inadequate to force such draconian measures. No emergency exists.
- 3. Substantial scientific evidence proves that wearing cloth face masks does not protect the wearer. COVID virus droplets, which to survive must be surrounded by a lipid (fat), can easily pass through the cotton mask cloth or simply pass around the mask periphery, as these are not sealed respirator-type masks.

Furthermore, masks do not protect your eyes. In fact, the exposed eye is the most easily infected part of the face! To actually protect the eyes, a person would need to wear tight fitting goggles

If you believe that face masks must be mandatory, then you must also believe that goggles to protect the eyes must be mandated!

- 4. Cotton mask proponents falsely argue that if someone is an asymptomatic carrier of the virus (no one has actually ever been identified as being one) and they breathe or sneeze, the virus will not escape the mask. Just as the virus can pass into the mask, it can pass out. So, they offer little to no protection to anyone.
- 5. Cotton masks are therefore useless to prevent the spread of the virus, and are nothing more than a "virtue signalling" ploy to self-proclaim as a "caring" individual.
- 6. Masks are not just merely a virtue symbol, they degrade the health of the wearer. Breathing one's CO2 and bacteria-laden breath for long periods of time can actually cause health risks including degraded immunity capability--the exact opposite of what we as a society are striving for.
- 7. OSHA has strict regulations for PPE workplace use of masks and respirators to guard against these types of risks (CO2 toxicity and bacteria ingestion), but these actual "safety" regulations have been illegally ignored in the current mass application of masking in the business workplace setting.
- 8. We have adopted the draconian CCP practice of forcing everyone to wear an ineffective mask, AS IF EVERYONE IS INFECTED as a way to blindly force obedience to power-hungry officials. What is the miniscule percentage of actually infected people in our county? Less than one percent (-0.1%). Yet, we are all being treated as infected criminals, commanded to kill our local businesses and to kow-tow to our elected "representatives" who serve solely with our consent, who are forcing dangerous measures with NO scientific support.
- 9. When will this insanity end?
- 10. When will our Health Department enforce OSHA mask regulations to protect the health of workers and the public from excessive mask usage resulting in CO2 toxicity and bacteria overload? The argument that medical professionals suffer no adverse effects also is not supported. OSHA provides hospital and health professional that do wear masks for lengthy periods to be medically tested and extensive additional oxygen enhancing equipment provided.
- 11. When will our County Supervisors exercise appropriate control over staff and require independent investigation of legal, scientific and other appropriate considerations, as well as tailoring based upon local considerations?
- 12. PLEASE ACCEPT THIS AS NOTICE THAT Failure to vote no on Item 37 and continued use of force, under the color of law, upon individuals and businesses by county departments of these counter-scientific unwarranted un-Constitutional measures will most certainly expose the county and individuals therein to corporate and personal liability.

SUMMARY OF THE REVISED COVID EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

What it applies to. Any business in Nevada County, whether for-profit or not-for-profit. (all businesses)

What is a violation. Any violation of any order issued by 1) the Governor, 2) the County Health Officer, 3) a Statewide public health directive, or 3) the County Environmental Health Department that exists now or in the future and is issued to limit the spread of COVID-19. (All of these are defined as "Covid-19 Orders")

Incorporation into County law. All Covid-19 Orders are incorporated into the Law of the County of Nevada. (Even future orders, without review or approval by the Supervisors.) Some of these orders may be illegal, unenforceable or unconstitutional. This incorporation into County Law legitimizes what could be unenforceable/unconstitutional orders.

Some examples of COVID-19 Orders: (All are examples of existing or potential Governor's and/or Health Official's orders.)

- No dining-in at restaurants
- · Dining outside without adequate distancing
- Employees/staff not wearing cotton or paper masks
- Employees/staff not practicing safe distancing
- Not enforcing mask orders or safe distancing upon customers in a business

- Operating a "non-essential" business. Like nail salon, fitness center, or whatever whim the Governor or County Health Officer decides at any time in the future.
- Use your imagination—could be anything that is ordered by a few officials, some just appointed, not
 elected. None of these orders would go through the usual legislative process as for a law or ordinance.
 This would fit the definition of a dictatorship, tyranny, oppressive government, legislation without
 representation. Like living in Nazi Germany or North Korea today.

Administrative fines/penalties. Each violation of a COVID-19 Order can result in daily fines of:

\$1,000 for the first violation

\$2,500 for the second violation

\$10,000 for the third violation

And, in addition, the County may revoke any County-issued permits. This can apply not just to restaurants but to ANY business.

Enforcing Officers. Can be a peace officer. Or the Health Officer, Code Compliance Officer, Environmental Health Officer, the Director of the Community Development Agency, or anyone designated by any of the foregoing administrative agencies.

These are draconian punishments.

SOME TALKING AND WRITING POINTS

- Restaurants that serve diners outside will be able to do so for only about two more months. Then, rains and cold weather will curtail business to a trickle, so by October ALL restaurants will be out of business. Take-out cannot sustain a restaurant at a profit in most cases. So, a business must choose whether to go bankrupt because their business is shuttered by the government or to go bankrupt for trying to perform their normal business. Like telling someone they are sentenced to die—here is a gun. You can kill yourself or we will do it. Don't tell me that is not draconian!
- The ordinance turns business owners into police by placing the burden on them to assure customers follow mask and other COVID-19 orders.
- Dining-in penalized. On what basis is there a distinction between being a customer in a restaurant and a customer in any business? Why is it ok for a customer to enter a grocery store, a pharmacy, a dry cleaner, a smoke shop, a liquor store, or any other business but not enter a restaurant? In any business, social distancing rules are in effect. The only answer is that one cannot wear a mask while eating or drinking, even if safely spaced from other diners. There are two factors here: fresh air flow and masking.
- Outside spaces allow fresh air/breezes to carry away any virus droplets. But some of our restaurants have installed higher rates of fresh air intake and advanced filtration systems into their HVAC systems. Similar as on airplanes. Yet, the one size fits all "COVID-19 Orders" do not recognize these fresh air and filtration measures and refuse to allow dining-in.
- Cotton or paper surgical masks are not effective in controlling a virus. These masks cannot stop a virus as
 their particle size are small enough to fit through the holes in the fabric or simply escape via the open
 edges of such loosely-worn masks, So, most of this draconian enforcement is based on invalid science.
 Here are the facts:
- A report from the CDC in May, 2020 evaluated different Personal Protective Measures (PPE) in limiting

- the spread of COVID. Hand hygiene was identified as effective, but regarding disposable medical masks and cotton masks it concludes "there is limited evidence for their effectiveness in preventing influenza virus transmission either when worn by the infected person for source control or when worn by uninfected persons to reduce exposure." https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/eid/article/26/5/19-0994 article
- An article published in the New England Journal of Medicine on April 1, 2020 on the topic of COVID-19 stated that "We know that wearing a mask outside health care facilities offers little, if any protection from infection." And goes on to say "the desire for widespread masking is a reflexive reaction to anxiety over the pandemic." The article was subsequently amended on June 3, 2020 to include the statement "We strongly support the calls of public health agencies for all people to wear masks when circumstances compel them to be within 6 ft. of others for sustained periods." Thus, spacing OR masking is adequate while neither is necessary for short interactions. https://www.nejm.org/doi/full/10.1056/NEJMp2006372
- The use of N95 respirators (unlike a cloth or surgical mask, a respirator is fitted to the face with an airtight seal) are not effective in stopping a virus. Quoting from a manufacturer of such masks: "Oil and fat-based particulates are very small and "slippery" for lack of a better term. They are often capable of penetrating filters that non-oil particulates cannot, even when those particulates are small. These include everything from certain hazardous chemicals to viruses like SARS, which has a lipid (fat) shell around it." The letter "N" means Not resistant to oil-based particulates. Thus if N95 respirators cannot stop a SARS virus then loose fitting cotton or paper masks cannot. (COVID is also referred to as SARS 2)
- Further on masks, there is significant controversy among health experts around the world on the
 effectiveness of masks. Many European countries do not require masks, and their death rates are low.
 Refer to this article for some perspective: https://fee.org/articles/europes-top-health-officials-say-masks-arent-helpful-in-beating-covid-19/
- Dine-in restaurants have reduced the seating capacity to create safe spacing between tables and diners
 not in one party. That spacing is adequate protection without the need for continuous masking while
 dining-in.
- Our county's recent increase in COVID cases cannot be traced to dining-in. It can be directly traced to some large weekend rave parties illegally held within the county over the 4th of July weekend.
- The Governor is applying a one-size-fits-all approach rather than allowing each county to assess the situation and apply appropriate measures.
- Punishing the County's restaurants punishes the county's citizens and ability to provide County services.
 Sales tax revenues have plummeted.
- The Governor's order to wear masks in all businesses has already activated the "Face Mask Fascists" in Nevada County to spy on and report businesses if an employee has to temporarily "come up for air" from continuously wearing the suffocating masks. Even if the employees are practicing safe distancing. One of our Supervisors has on social media whipped up these Fascists to report to the county so enforcement officers can go out and inspect, issue citations and fines, and this is directed at all businesses, not just for

restaurants—a bank was targeted! That is despicable and like the Gestapo or Stassi secret police.

- Some of our businesses have been physically attacked and vandalized already by vigilantes who are
 empowered by the draconian measures being taken by our county and believe they have the right to take
 matters into their own hands. Passage of this Ordinance will make this issue worse. We are now a
 lawless society, enabled and encouraged by our County's staff and Supervisors.
- The Governor is promising monetary aid to our county for legitimizing his dictatorial and illegal orders. A small benefit for the much greater damage that will be inflicted on our county's businesses for years to come.
- The number of cases identified in the US has risen, based mainly on more frequent testing. But the death rates are dropping around the country because of better understanding of the virus and how to treat it. The single death in Nevada County was to a very elderly person with terminal cancer who wanted to spend her last days in her Truckee home. There are only 20 active cases in our county as of today

I demand that this issue be heard in front of a live community audience. Ours is the only county in the state to have the Supervisors hide from the public.

Restaurants that serve diners outside will be able to do so for only about two more months. Then, rains and cold weather will curtail business to a trickle, so by October ALL restaurants will be out of business. Take-out cannot sustain a restaurant at a profit in most cases. The use of N95 respirators (unlike a cloth or surgical mask, a respirator is fitted to the face with an airtight seal) are not effective in stopping a virus. Quoting from a manufacturer of such masks: "Oil and fat-based particulates are very small and "slippery" for lack of a better term. They are often capable of penetrating filters that non-oil particulates cannot, even when those particulates are small. These include everything from certain hazardous chemicals to viruses like SARS, which has a lipid (fat) shell around it." The letter "N" means Not resistant to oil-based particulates. Thus if N95 respirators cannot stop a SARS virus then loose fitting cotton or paper masks cannot. (COVID is also referred to as SARS 2)

Further on masks, there is significant controversy among health experts around the world on the effectiveness of masks. Many European countries do not require masks, and their death rates are low. Dine-in restaurants have reduced the seating capacity to create safe spacing between tables and diners not in one party. That spacing is adequate protection without the need for continuous masking while dining-in.

Our county's recent increase in COVID cases cannot be traced to dining-in. It can be directly traced to some large weekend rave parties illegally held within the county over the 4th of July weekend.

The Governor is applying a one-size-fits-all approach rather than allowing each county to assess the situation and apply appropriate measures.

Punishing the County's restaurants punishes the county's citizens and ability to provide County services. Sales tax revenues have plummeted.

Actual illness and death rates associated with this COVID "influenza" are less than cases of annual flu. We have never needed to be in a state of emergency causing such hardship and destroying our local economy. Therefore, the County should officially terminate any state of emergency and all mandates, guidelines or requirements not based on verifiable information. Also, it's irresponsible for the Board of Supervisors not to hear both sides of this issue before making decisions that affect us all.

According to the World Health Organization's June 5, 2020, guidance on face mask use, there's no direct evidence that universal masking of healthy people is an effective intervention against respiratory illnesses. While masks do not prevent the spread of viral infections, the WHO still makes a case for universal mask-wearing, citing benefits such as reduced stigmatization of people caring for COVID-19 patients in nonclinical

settings, making people feel like they're doing something to help, serving as a reminder to be compliant with other measures, and economic benefits for people who can sew homemade masks. These do not see compelling enough reasons for Nevada County. SARS-CoV-2 is a beta-coronavirus with a diameter between 60 nanometers (nm) and 140 nm, or 0.06 to 0.14 microns (micrometers).2 This is about half the size of most viruses, which tend to measure between 0.02 microns to 0.3 microns. Virus-laden saliva or respiratory droplets expelled when talking or coughing measure between 5 and 10 microns, and it is these droplets that surgical masks and respirators can block.

I am writing to strongly oppose Item 26, the temporary Urgency Ordinance related to enforcement of COVID-related.

You need to treat People as adults and trust that they care deeply about the health of their customers and they know how to protect them. Take some guidance from Gov. Noome of South Dakota. Have faith in your constituents. We are smarter than you think.

I have over 45 years of Clinical and Research laboratory experience and I am licensed by the State of Calif. For me to work in a hospital, I have to undergo extensive training in all aspects of laboratory testing including, yes, how to properly wear and use a mask and eye protection. I worked in a high complexity lab that demanded sterile conditions because we worked with transplant patients that were immune compromised. Bacteria and viruses much less lethal than Sars could kill them. You have absolutely no idea the risk you are putting people in by forcing them to wear a mask without proper education and competency evaluations.

The data tells us, for the most part, Covid 19 overwhelmingly affects older people and those with co-morbid conditions. We all know this, so let this cohort decide for themselves if they would rather stay home and be safe or risk having a good meal with some socializing. Let the rest eat out and enjoy. If they get sick, the risk of death is no greater than the yearly flu. Treat us like the adults we are.

Additional Points:

A smart lawyer, eager to make a name for him/herself, could probably make a good case against those that are demanding mask wearing without adequately offering special training in the use of a proper mask as well as protective eye wear.

Dining-in penalized. On what basis is there a distinction between being a customer in a restaurant and a customer in any business? Why is it ok for a customer to enter a grocery store, a pharmacy, a dry cleaner, a smoke shop, a liquor store, or any other business but not enter a restaurant? In any business, social distancing rules are in effect. The only answer is that one cannot wear a mask while eating or drinking, even if safely spaced from other diners. There are two factors here: fresh air flow and masking.

Outside spaces allow fresh air/breezes to carry away any virus droplets. But some of our restaurants have installed higher rates of fresh air intake and advanced filtration systems into their HVAC systems. Similar as on airplanes. Yet, the one size fits all "COVID-19 Orders" do not recognize these fresh air and filtration measures and refuse to allow dining-in.

I am writing to you in opposition to the fairly draconian fines and enforcement being considered in Item 26 of the Covid-19 Emergency Ordinance.

Thankfully, Nevada County has not experienced the dramatic numbers of Covid-19 cases which resulted in serious illness, hospitalization, or deaths, which have occurred in other counties around the country. I have also found that every business I have entered has gone to great lengths to ensure safety and cleanliness for its employees and its customers. In this time of distress, both physically and economically, our community must do everything within its power to help our small businesses remain open and viable. We have already seen a number of establishments close, as they have not been able to weather the lack of income and the uncertainty of the times. We DO NOT WANT TO SEE ANY MORE BUSINESSES LEAVE OUR COMMUNITY!! Just yesterday, when leaving the public parking lot on Main Street in Grass Valley, I noted that 3 businesses in a row were shuttered and

permanently closed - and that was just on one block. The viability, as well as the vitality of our community depends upon these businesses!

The fines recommended to be imposed upon non-compliant business are designed to quite literally put them out of business. I am not suggesting that a business may remain open while completely ignoring safety and health precautions, but I don't believe that we are witnessing that type of behaviour. Our business owners, whether they be manicurists, grocers, restauranteurs, or dentists, are all doing their best to protect their employees and serve their customers. If an issue of non-compliance is witnessed or reported, educating the business owner on the proper conduct would be in order - but not a \$10,000 fine!

Please do not burden our already struggling business community with the threat of draconian fines or loss of licensing. This divisive measure is in no one's best interest - not the citizens, not the business owners, not the county.

I oppose item 26 (Urgency Ordinance) on the agenda for the upcoming BOS meeting on Tuesday, August 11.

Additionally, although California Government Code section 53069.4 is mentioned in the proposed ordinance it does not appear to me as though anyone read it. The following is from your proposed ordinance (Section I Part M.):

California Government Code section 53069.4 provides authority to the Nevada County Board of Supervisors to set administrative fines or penalties for violation of any ordinance enacted by the Nevada County Board of Supervisors....

Here are the relevant parts of the code section you referenced:

Government Code Section 53069.4:

(1) The legislative body of a local agency ... may by ordinance make any violation of any ordinance enacted by the local agency subject to an administrative fine or penalty. Where the violation would otherwise be an infraction, the administrative fine or penalty shall not exceed the maximum fine or penalty amounts for infractions set forth in subdivision (b) of Section 25132 and subdivision (b) of Section 36900.

And here is a copy of the above mentioned code sections defining the limits of the fines local agencies are authorized to impose:

Government Code Sections 25132 and 36900 (b):

(b) Every violation determined to be an infraction is punishable by (1) a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) for a first violation; (2) a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for a second violation of the same ordinance within one year; (3) a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500) for each additional violation of the same ordinance within one year.

Are not your proposed fines illegal?

You also mention California Health and Safety Code Sections 120275 and 120295. Both of these apply solely to the quarantine and disinfection of diseased persons and their things and cannot possibly be applied to support your leveling fines on people not proven to be diseased because they dined indoors vs. outdoors.

Finally, I cannot understand why you are attempting to prevent healthy people from getting immune to covid-19. Those with no risk factors for severe covid-19 (and that's over 90 percent of the US population) should be praised not vilified for being willing to take off their masks and risk contracting and becoming immune to the virus. Every breath taken by a covid immune purifies the air and protects those at high risk. Any healthy person who's not immune is just part of the problem and is doing nothing to protect the vulnerable. I am writing to oppose the ordinance, I tem 26, related to COVID-19 which is on your August 11 agenda.

Governor Newsom is trying to enforce a "ONE SIZE FITS ALL" approach to all CA counties. This is a rural community. We have very few local businesses as it is. Putting these businesses in harm's way will only contribute to a ghost town... no businesses, no jobs, no people, **NO TAXES**.

Businesses are bending over backwards to follow the rules. Restaurants have moved outside into the fresh air and spaced their tables at appropriate distances. Businesses have posted signs saying "keep social distancing, and masks are REQUIRED to enter the building." Customers are allowed to enter pharmacies, grocery stores, hardware stores, liquor stores, etc., but not restaurants or churches while "social distancing"... and while wearing masks?

1. SUMMARY OF THE REVISED COVID EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

What it applies to. Any business in Nevada County, whether for-profit or not-for-profit. (all businesses)

What is a violation. Any violation of any order issued by 1) the Governor, 2) the County Health Officer, 3) a Statewide public health directive, or 3) the County Environmental Health Department that exists now or in the future and is issued to limit the spread of COVID-19. (All of these are defined as "Covid-19 Orders")

Incorporation into County law. All Covid-19 Orders are incorporated into the Law of the County of Nevada. (Even future orders, without review or approval by the Supervisors.) Some of these orders may be illegal, unenforceable or unconstitutional. This incorporation into County Law legitimizes what could be unenforceable/unconstitutional orders.

Some examples of COVID-19 Orders: (All are examples of existing or potential Governor's and/or Health Official's orders.)

- No dining-in at restaurants
- 2. Dining outside without adequate distancing
- 3. Employees/staff not wearing cotton or paper masks
- Employees/staff not practicing safe distancing
- 5. Not enforcing mask orders or safe distancing upon customers in a business
- 6. Operating a "non-essential" business. Like nail salon, fitness center, or

whatever whim the Governor or County Health Officer decides at any time in the future.

7. Use your imagination—could be anything that is ordered by a few officials, some just appointed, not elected. None of these orders would go through the usual legislative process as for a law or ordinance. This would fit the definition of a dictatorship, tyranny, oppressive government, legislation without representation. Like living in Nazi Germany or North Korea today.

Administrative fines/penalties. Each violation of a COVID-19 Order can result in <u>daily</u> fines of:

\$1,000 for the first violation

\$2.500 for the second violation

\$10,000 for the third violation

And, in addition, the County may revoke any County-issued permits. This can apply not just to restaurants but to ANY business.

Enforcing Officers. Can be a peace officer. Or the Health Officer, Code Compliance Officer, Environmental Health Officer, the Director of the Community Development Agency, or anyone designated by any of the foregoing administrative agencies.

These are draconian punishments.

2. SOME TALKING AND WRITING POINTS

- 1. Restaurants that serve diners outside will be able to do so for only about two more months. Then, rains and cold weather will curtail business to a trickle, so by October ALL restaurants will be out of business. Take-out cannot sustain a restaurant at a profit in most cases. So, a business must choose whether to go bankrupt because their business is shuttered by the government or to go bankrupt for trying to perform their normal business. Like telling someone they are sentenced to die—here is a gun. You can kill yourself or we will do it. Don't tell me that is not draconian!
- 2. The ordinance turns business owners into police by placing the burden on them to assure customers follow mask and other COVID-19 orders.
- 3. Dining-in penalized. On what basis is there a distinction between being a customer in a restaurant and a customer in any business? Why is it ok for a customer to enter a grocery store, a pharmacy, a dry cleaner, a smoke shop, a liquor store, or any other business but not enter a restaurant? In any business, social distancing rules are in effect. The only answer is that one cannot wear a mask while eating or drinking, even if safely spaced from other diners. There are two factors here: fresh air flow and masking.
- 4. Outside spaces allow fresh air/breezes to carry away any virus droplets. But some of our restaurants have installed higher rates of fresh air intake and

advanced filtration systems into their HVAC systems. Similar as on airplanes. Yet, the one size fits all "COVID-19 Orders" do not recognize these fresh air and filtration measures and refuse to allow dining-in.

- 5. Cotton or paper surgical masks are not effective in controlling a virus. These masks cannot stop a virus as their particle size are small enough to fit through the holes in the fabric or simply escape via the open edges of such loosely-worn masks, So, most of this draconian enforcement is based on invalid science. Here are the facts:
 - a. A **report from the CDC** in May, 2020 evaluated different Personal Protective Measures (PPE) in limiting the spread of COVID. Hand hygiene was identified as effective, but regarding disposable medical masks and cotton masks it concludes "there is limited evidence for their effectiveness in preventing influenza virus transmission either when worn by the infected person for source control or when worn by uninfected persons to reduce exposure." https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/eid/article/26/5/19-0994_article
 - b. An article published in the **New England Journal of Medicine** on April 1, 2020 on the topic of COVID-19 stated that "We know that wearing a mask outside health care facilities offers little, if any protection from infection." And goes on to say "the desire for widespread masking is a reflexive reaction to anxiety over the pandemic." The article was subsequently amended on June 3, 2020 to include the statement "We strongly support the calls of public health agencies for all people to wear masks when circumstances compel them to be within 6 ft. of others for sustained periods." Thus, spacing OR masking is adequate while neither is necessary for short interactions.

- c. The use of N95 respirators (unlike a cloth or surgical mask, a respirator is fitted to the face with an airtight seal) are not effective in stopping a virus. Quoting from a manufacturer of such masks: "Oil and fat-based particulates are very small and "slippery" for lack of a better term. They are often capable of penetrating filters that non-oil particulates cannot, even when those particulates are small. These include everything from certain hazardous chemicals to viruses like SARS, which has a lipid (fat) shell around it." The letter "N" means Not resistant to oil-based particulates. Thus if N95 respirators cannot stop a SARS virus then loose fitting cotton or paper masks cannot. (COVID is also referred to as SARS 2)
- 6. Further on masks, there is significant controversy among health experts around the world on the effectiveness of masks. Many European countries do not require masks, and their death rates are low. Refer to this article for some perspective: https://fee.org/articles/europes-top-health-officials-say-masks-arent-helpful-in-beating-covid-19/
- 7. Dine-in restaurants have reduced the seating capacity to create safe spacing between tables and diners not in one party. That spacing is adequate

protection without the need for continuous masking while dining-in.

- 8. Our county's recent increase in COVID cases cannot be traced to dining-in. It can be directly traced to some large weekend rave parties illegally held within the county over the 4th of July weekend.
- 9. The Governor is applying a one-size-fits-all approach rather than allowing each county to assess the situation and apply appropriate measures.
- 10. Punishing the County's restaurants punishes the county's citizens and ability to provide County services. Sales tax revenues have plummeted.
- 11. The Governor's order to wear masks in all businesses has already activated the "Face Mask Fascists" in Nevada County to spy on and report businesses if an employee has to temporarily "come up for air" from continuously wearing the suffocating masks. Even if the employees are practicing safe distancing. One of our Supervisors has on social media whipped up these Fascists to report to the county so enforcement officers can go out and inspect, issue citations and fines, and this is directed at all businesses, not just for restaurants—a bank was targeted! That is despicable and like the Gestapo or Stassi secret police.
- 12. Some of our businesses have been physically attacked and vandalized already by vigilantes who are empowered by the draconian measures being taken by our county and believe they have the right to take matters into their own hands. Passage of this Ordinance will make this issue worse. We are now a lawless society, enabled and encouraged by our County's staff and Supervisors.
- 13. The Governor is promising monetary aid to our county for legitimizing his dictatorial and illegal orders. A small benefit for the much greater damage that will be inflicted on our county's businesses for years to come.
- 14. The number of cases identified in the US has risen, based mainly on more frequent testing. But the death rates are dropping around the country because of better understanding of the virus and how to treat it. The single death in Nevada County was to a very elderly person with terminal cancer who wanted to spend her last days in her Truckee home. There are only 20 active cases in our county as of today.

These are draconian punishments.

document is meant to 1) summarize the key ordinance points in less than one page and 2) provide some facts and discussion/writing points to use when messaging the Supervisors. The proper way to submit public comments to all supervisors before Monday evening, 8-10-20 follows section 2 below.

1. SUMMARY OF THE REVISED COVID EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

What it applies to. <u>Any business in Nevada County</u>, whether for-profit or not-for-profit. (all businesses)

What is a violation. Any violation of any order issued by 1) the Governor, 2) the County Health Officer, 3) a Statewide public health directive, or 3) the County Environmental Health Department that exists now or in the future and is issued to limit the spread of COVID-19. (All of these are defined as "Covid-19 Orders")

Incorporation into County law. All Covid-19 Orders are incorporated into the Law of the County of Nevada. (Even future orders, without review or approval by the Supervisors.) Some of these orders may be illegal, unenforceable or unconstitutional. This incorporation into County Law legitimizes what could be

unenforceable/unconstitutional orders.

Some examples of COVID-19 Orders: (All are examples of existing or potential Governor's and/or Health Official's orders.)

- 1. No dining-in at restaurants
- 2. Dining outside without adequate distancing
- 3. Employees/staff not wearing cotton or paper masks
- 4. Employees/staff not practicing safe distancing
- 5. Not enforcing mask orders or safe distancing upon customers in a business
- 6. Operating a "non-essential" business. Like nail salon, fitness center, or whatever whim the Governor or County Health Officer decides at any time in the future.
- 7. Use your imagination—could be anything that is ordered by a few officials, some just appointed, not elected. None of these orders would go through the usual legislative process as for a law or ordinance. This would fit the definition of a dictatorship, tyranny, oppressive government, legislation without representation. Like living in Nazi Germany or North Korea today.

Administrative fines/penalties. Each violation of a COVID-19 Order can result in daily fines of:

And, in addition, the County may revoke any County-issued permits. This can apply not just to restaurants but to ANY business.

- 3. Dining-in penalized. On what basis is there a distinction between being a customer in a restaurant and a customer in any business? Why is it ok for a customer to enter a grocery store, a pharmacy, a dry cleaner, a smoke shop, a liquor store, or any other business but not enter a restaurant? In any business, social distancing rules are in effect. The only answer is that one cannot wear a mask while eating or drinking, even if safely spaced from other diners. There are two factors here: fresh air flow and masking.
- 4. Outside spaces allow fresh air/breezes to carry away any virus droplets. But some of our restaurants have installed higher rates of fresh air intake and advanced filtration systems into their HVAC systems. Similar as on airplanes. Yet, the one size fits all "COVID-19 Orders" do not recognize these fresh air and filtration measures and refuse to allow dining-in.
- 5. Cotton or paper surgical masks are not effective in controlling a virus. The ordinance can appoint anyone to be directed to review compliance.

Also, our board has voted to not have this meeting open to the public and to provide live testimony prior to their vote. Nevada County is the only county in California to take this action. This among the other elements of this message is a clear harbinger of things to come if we do not stem the tide embodied by this draconian legislation.

This is a prime example of our fundamental freedoms being taken from us when we do have the opportunity with the simplest of emails to make a difference in our much loved community.

I strongly suggest that you vote no on SR 3359 and end this unnecessary and punitive attack on our struggling local restaurants. Right now, they need the help and assistance from all of us to stay open. The spread of COVID-19 in Nevada County is still very low, with everyone who has contracted it recovering, except for one elderly person.

We can keep the restaurants open (even seating inside) if people still follow the protocols of wearing a mask when entering and sitting at tables appropriately spaced. The waitstaff, of course, would wear masks, not face shields.

During the pandemic, since March, Curt and I (both in our 70's) have eaten at Sergio's and Diego's with friends. At Sergios we have eaten both inside and outside. That restaurant has waitstaff wearing masks and is extremely careful with cleaning tables and chairs between customers. I have observed this. Perhaps County Health Department staff can provide better training for

restaurant workers during this time. Most food preparers have taken the California Food Handlers license.

Governor Gavin Newsom has imposed sweeping and damaging Covid-related rules on all counties, without any involvement of the Legislature.
