OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION APPROVING A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF NEVADA AND THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES TO ACCEPT THE CAPITAL ASSET DONATION OF SIX SURPLUS TRAVEL TRAILERS FOR TEMPORARY HOUSING OF INDIVIDUALS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS AND IN NEED OF TEMPORARY HOUSING, QUARANTINE AND/OR ISOLATION DUE TO COVID-19.

WHEREAS, the California Office of Emergency Services distributed travel trailers to local jurisdictions in April of 2020 in an effort to expand COVID-19 housing options at the local level; and

WHEREAS, the City of Los Angeles, California, has in their possession surplus CalOES travel trailers that are available for re-distribution to other jurisdictions within the State of California; and

WHEREAS, the City of Los Angeles is offering to donate six (6) travel trailers, with an estimated fair market value of \$25,000 each, to the County of Nevada; and

WHEREAS, the cost to transport six (6) trailers from the City of Los Angeles to Nevada County, as well as registration and taxes, is estimated not to exceed \$22,875; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of the capital asset trailers, the County of Nevada will utilize them on behalf of individuals experiencing homelessness and in need of temporary housing, quarantine and/or isolation due to COVID-19.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Nevada, State of California, that the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County of Nevada and the City of Los Angeles be and hereby is approved in substantially the form attached hereto, and that the Chair of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to execute the MOU on behalf of the County of Nevada.

BE IT FURTHE RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors accepts the donation of six travel trailers valued from the City of Los Angeles, California in furtherance of offering temporary housing options for individuals experiencing homelessness and in need of temporary housing, quarantine and/or isolation due to COVID-19.
