Key Points:

- Builds off the success of Operation Sugarloaf interim "navigation" pilot program and expands the model to Truckee
- **Provides** Non-congregant shelter to vulnerable homeless residents of Nevada County
- **Responds** to both the need for winter weather sheltering and COVID-19 isolation/social distancing



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Key Points (Continued):

- Expands the partnership County, Hospitality House, Sierra Roots, AMI Housing, HOME team, Truckee Emergency Warming Shelter, City of Nevada City, and Town of Truckee
- Leverages the skills of multiple service providers to accelerate housing placements and service linkage
- Adds up to 65 beds to the shelter system during the winter months and FREES UP 15 beds at Hospitality House

NEVADA COUNTY

WESTERN COUNTY EASTERN COUNTY

- 30 Rooms at local hotels*
- 10-person capacity at Veterans Hall in Nevada City for extreme weather overflow
- 9 travel trailers for COVID-19 isolation
- Weather triggered Hotel vouchers for additional overflow

- 6 rooms a local hotel*
- 10-person capacity at Veterans Hall in Truckee for extreme weather overflow
- Weather triggered Hotel vouchers for additional overflow

*Hotels sites will run every day with onsite case management and housing navigation services



OUTCOMES:

- 50% of participants secure housing outcome in 60 days (Nov. 2 to Dec. 30)
- 70% positive service connection (26 households) -
 - -Increased Income

-Linkage to services (mental health, Medical, Treatment etc.) -Removing barriers to housing (clearing of issues that inhibit securing housing)

- 100% of participants entered into the Coordinated Entry System
- Self-report of participants feeling increased connection to community and positive service outcomes
- High collaboration and satisfaction from key partners
