Background

- The Per Capita Grant Program originated from Proposition 68, a \$4 billion general obligation bond act that was passed by voters on June 5, 2018. It is a NON-COMPETITE grant program.
- Per Capita funds were awarded to eligible GRANTEES on a population basis.
 - Grass Valley, Nevada City, Town of Truckee, Bear River RPD, Oak Tree PRD, Truckee-Donner RPD and Western Gateway RPD were all allocated the minimum amount of \$177,952.
 - Nevada County was allocated the minimum amount of \$400,000.
- Funds are to be used for CAPITAL OUTLAY PROJECTS (no operations, repairs or maintenance). The effort should result in local park rehabilitation, creation, and improvement.
- GRANTEES are encouraged to partner with other GRANTEES on PROJECTS.



Per Capita Grant Requirements

- Each Grantee must pass an Authorizing Resolution.
- All project applications must be submitted by December 2021.
- Projects that do not serve a severely disadvantaged community (median household income less than 60% of the statewide average) require a 20% match.
- Projects must be consistent with the park and recreation element of the [city/county/district's] general or recreation plan.

VIIN KEI

- The primary purpose of the project is to provide public recreation (not offices or studies).
- Projects must be ADA accessible; including an accessible path of travel.

Additional Rules

- All or part of a grantee's Per Capita allocation can be transferred to another eligible grantee (city/town or park district) with the same rules and restrictions.
- Land ownership/agreement required.
- Deed restriction required
- Pre-construction costs may not exceed 25% of the project cost.
- Available for public use within 3 years.



Grant Process & Timeline

- Pass the Authorizing Resolution now
- Submit project application package(s) by December 2021
- Supervisors execute contract by June 2022
- Complete project by December 2023



Projects Evaluated

- July Staff prepared a list of potential projects. The Grass Valley Veteran's Hall main floor (\$160,000) was most qualified.
- August Staff involved the Western Nevada County Recreation Coalition and Truckee to ensure there were no missed opportunities for collaboration or impact.
- Coalition participants preferred a pass through of surplus funds or an PV Playfield **RFP** process among ELIGIBLE GRANTEES.

Potential Project Details

• GV Veteran's Building

- Meets all grant requirements
- Ready to build
- Provides multiple recreation opportunities (volleyball, basketball, pickleball, fencing and community events)
- No match required
- CEQA Categorically Exempt

- Independence Trail
 - Provides benefits to multiple user groups
 - Nationally significant project (first accessible wilderness trail).
 - Requires a 20-30 year nonrevocable Land Tenure agreement and responsibility for maintenance and operation.
 - CEQA prepared by State Parks.

Recommendation

- Approve the authorizing resolution.
- Authorize staff to prepare a project application to replace the Grass Valley Veteran's Building main floor (timing).
- Provide staff direction on use of Per Capita funds for rebuilding the Independence Trail.
- Provide staff direction regarding the development of an RFP process to solicit requests from eligible grantees for the remaining County funds.
- Follow up with Supervisors during the annual Workshop and provide a progress report.



Historical Distribution of Per Capita Funding




