ACTION TAKEN: Chair Miller introduced the agenda item and Ms. Rachel Roos, Director of Social Services, reviewed the staff report and provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding the Great Plates Program, a collaboration between the County's service providers and County departments.

Over 36,000 meals have been served to date. The Program was developed in response to the COVID-19 pandemic as a short-term support system designed to serve adults 65 and older and adults 60-64 who are at high-risk from COVID-19. Ms. Roos explained that the Program serves individuals who are unable to leave their homes and purchase or prepare meals, and are not receiving nutritional assistance from other state or federal programs. The Program is funded through the state and federal government and CARES Act funding.

She requested approval of General fund monies in the amount of \$31,000 to continue support of the Program, and noted that the vendors are locally owned establishments, which provides a much needed economic stimulus within the community. Ms. Roos added that the vendors employ 40 local individuals to prepare and deliver the meals.

Board questioning and discussion ensued.

16. <u>SR 21-0051</u> Public hearing to consider proposed increases to the Truckee Fire Protection District 2020/21 Capital and Mitigation Fees based on Truckee Fire Protection District Capital Improvement Plan and Mitigation Fee 5-Year Expenditure Plan and 5-Year Findings Report for Fiscal year 2020/21 and Truckee Fire Protection District Resolution No. 19-2020. If approved, the new fees will become effective 60 days after the adoption of the resolution.

> Resolution adopting Development Impact Mitigation Fees for the Truckee Fire Protection District, pursuant to Nevada County Land Use and Development Code Section L-IX 2.3, effective March 26, 2021: Residential - Single Family \$0.84 per square foot, Multi-family \$1.27 per square foot; Nonresidential -Industrial \$0.62 per square foot, Retail/Commercial \$0.86 per square foot, and Office \$1.24 per square foot.

ACTION TAKEN: Following a break, Chair Miller called the meeting to order, and read the title of the public hearing into the record.

Mr. Brian Foss, Planning Director, reviewed the staff report regarding the rate increase for the Truckee Fire Protection District's (TFPD) 2020/21 Capital and Mitigation Fee rate increase, effective March 26, 2021. Mr. Foss explained that pursuant to the Land Use and Development Code of the County of Nevada, mitigation fees for Special Districts, such as Park and Fire Districts, must be adopted by the Board of Supervisors in order for them to go into effect. The Truckee Fire Protection District held a noticed public meeting with their Board on November 17, 2020, and adopted a rate increase as follows: Residential - Single Family \$0.84 per square foot, Multi-family \$1.27 per square foot; Nonresidential - Industrial \$0.62 per square foot, Retail/Commercial \$0.86 per square foot, and Office \$1.24 per square foot.

Fire Chief Bill Seline, Truckee Fire Protection District, reported that the 1.7% increase was based on a 20-Cities Construction Cost Index (CCI) as outlined in the Plan. He explained that Ms. Pat Davison, Executive Director, Contractors Association of Truckee Tahoe (CATT), has been an interested stakeholder over the years, and provided support for the increase. CATT has been a proponent of bringing the inflationary increases forward on a regular basis, no matter how small, to prevent larger increases over time.

Chair Miller opened the public hearing for public comment, and Ms. Julie Patterson Hunter, Clerk of the Board, read a letter from Mr. Peter G. Fenolio, CATT Government Affairs Manager, into the record. There being no further public comment, Chair Miller closed the public comment portion of the hearing.

Board discussion ensued.

MOTION: Motion made by Supervisor Bullock, seconded by Supervisor Hoek, to adopt Resolution No. 21-025. On a roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Rose invited the recipients of the awards working at the Eric Rood Administrative Center to pick up their pins and delicious cupcakes by driving their car through the round-about at the front of the building between 12:30 to 1:30 p.m., where Human Resources staff will hand them out in a COVID-safe manner. He invited the Board members to join them. For employees working in Truckee, pins and cupcakes will be delivered directly to their offices.
