In mid-March last year, I was admitted to a hospital on the West Side of Manhattan with Covid. I spent a week in a coma on a ventilator and, after miraculously surviving, another week in an isolation room. When I went into the hospital, America was still open. When I woke up, it was closed. I remember thinking, "Wow, isn't that something of an over-reaction"?

I certainly didn't want others to go through what I did, so I accepted that surprising decision. However, two weeks to flatten the curve has now reached a full year of lockdowns. Despite all efforts, Covid is still here, still deadly, still threatening.

Many argue that it would have been worse without the lockdowns. Perhaps, but the disease seems to have spread just as quickly in heavily locked down states like New York and California as it did in those with far fewer restrictions. Yet we keep listening to the same "experts" prescribing the same "solutions," over and over.

These lockdowns are an extraordinary imposition on our Constitutional freedoms. We have been extraordinarily patient and accommodating in complying voluntarily with these restrictions. Now it is time to try something different, to escape from endless futile charges across the same deeply-cratered battlefield as though we are fighting the First World War.

Let's try opening up. Open our churches. Restaurants. Gyms. Hair salons. Theaters. Government offices.

I write to voice my opposition to this resolution. The science and data do not support the implementation of such a relaxation of the Covid restrictions under which we current operate, which is the purple tier under CA State Covid protocol.

- 1. **Our positivity rate is 9.4%**. This means community spread remains uncontrolled. Literally, almost 1 in ten of us could still be contracting, or transmitting the virus.
- 2. We have fully vaccinated substantially less than 25% of the population, much less the 70-80% that will be required to actually consider returning to "normal". At our current pace, it is possible to reach this goal by early May or sooner.
