ACTION TAKEN: Chair Miller introduced the consent calendar. Referencing Agenda Items #23 through #28, Supervisor Bullock thanked the individuals who stepped up to community service by representing District V on various committees and commissions. He highlighted Raymond Butler's 33 years of dedicated public service through his work as the District V representative on the Fish and Wildlife Commission.

MOTION: Motion made by Supervisor Bullock, and seconded by Supervisor Scofield, to approve the consent calendar. On a roll call vote the motion passed unanimously.

31. SR 21-0227 Tahoe National Forest (TNF), 2021 Update. (Mr. Eli Ilano, Forest Supervisor, TNF)

Presentation provided.

ACTION TAKEN: Forest Supervisor Eli Ilano, Tahoe National Forest (TFN), provided a PowerPoint presentation on their activities in 2020, highlighting efforts to treat 20,000 acres of hazardous fuels. Activities planned for 2021 include a large scale restoration of Van Meadows; the Lady Bug Project, which straddles the Nevada County/Sierra County border; the California Route 20 Realignment Project; a watershed project along Boca Reservoir; the Western Nevada County Community Defense Project; and the PG&E Lake Fordyce Dam Seepage Mitigation Project.

Forest Supervisor Ilano reported that they experienced a 400% increase of visitors to TFN in 2020 due to the pandemic. A concern resulting from the renewed interest in camping was an increase in escaped and illegal campfires. To mitigate this for the upcoming camping season, plans are in place to increase education and patrol. He reported that in 2020 their Christmas tree permit program went online, resulting in the sale of 10,000 permits, and noted an increase in usage of Donner Summit's snow play areas. Plans are in place for proactive management of these areas moving forward.

Forest Supervisor Ilano reported on their activities with the South Yuba River Safety Cohort, which is working to manage increased usage along the Yuba River Corridor. Forest Supervisor Ilano mentioned TNF's work on expansion of the East Zone Connectivity Project and construction of the final portion of the Pines to Mines trail, which connects Nevada City to the Town of Truckee. He ended the presentation and welcomed the Board's questions.

Board discussion and questioning ensued.

Chair Miller provided an opportunity for public comment and Matthew Coulter, District III, provided comments. There being no further public comment on this item, Chair Miller closed public comment and thanked Forest Supervisor Ilano for his report.

(Introduce/Waive further reading/Adopt) An Ordinance amending Chapter II of Title 3 of the Nevada County Land Use and Development Code regarding Administrative Enforcement and Cannabis Cultivation.

Continued.

ACTION TAKEN: Following a short break, Chair Miller called the meeting back into order, introduced the public hearing, and read the title of the proposed Ordinance into the record.

Craig Griesbach, Building Director, and Jeff Merriman, Code Compliance Program Manager, provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding the proposed amendments to Land Use and Development Code as it relates to Cannabis Cultivation and Enforcement. The proposed revisions include: 1) combining sections to centralize and streamline administrative enforcement; 2) modifying definition of the "Responsible Party" to make it broader and to include agents, employees and contractors; 3) clarifying authority for and timing of fines and penalties; 4) clarifying when a Notice of Violation is issued in conjunction with a fine or penalty; 5) modifying the administrative appeals procedures; 6) clarifying procedures related to administrative inspection warrants; 7) collection of delinquent fines, penalties, and abatement costs; and 8) removing the internal administration citation review. Jeff Merriman clarified that the Ordinance was originally adopted on May 14, 201; they have learned a lot during the first two years and staff is confident that the proposed changes will improve the process.

Following a short technical break, Chair Miller called the meeting back to order and opened the public hearing for public comment. The following members of the public provided comments: Sandy Bacon, District I; Matthew Coulter, District III; John Foley, District IV; Sarah Smale, District IV; Jeffrey Cameron, District II; Mark Shafer, District IV; Mike Ingram, District IV; Wade Laughter, District I; Diana Gamzon, Executive Director, Nevada County Cannabis Alliance; Gene Luster, District II; Debbie Porter, District II; and Maggie Phillipsborn, District IV. There being no further public comment, Chair Miller closed the public comment portion of the public hearing.

Staff responded to the Board's questions and concerns, and discussion ensued regarding the language in the proposed Ordinance.

After listening to public comment Supervisor Scofield suggested that the parties involved should come together one more time to have a second look at the Ordinance. He proposed two Supervisors be selected to meet with representatives from the Cannabis Alliance and other interested parties to review proposed changes. He suggested they focus on the egregious violators and illegal growers, and look at other ways to address enforcement.

Board discussion continued.

A recommendation was made for staff to: 1) work with Supervisors Hall and Scofield to refine the language in the Ordinance as discussed by the Board; and 2) return to the Board for discussion/direction relating to enforcement tools and priorities in order to address cannabis compliance and egregious violators.

MOTION: Motion made by Supervisor Hall, seconded by Supervisor Scofield, directing staff to work with Supervisors Hall and Scofield to refine the language in the Ordinance as discussed and return to the Board as soon as possible. On a voice vote the motion passed unanimously.
