Presentation provided.

ACTION TAKEN: Superintendent Brett McFadden, Nevada Joint Union High School District (NJUHSD), and Linda Melugin, NJUHSD Scholarship Coordinator, provided a presentation entitled The NJUHSD 2020/21 School Year and Beyond. Superintendent McFadden reviewed the challenges the District experienced due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Superintendent reported on the District's major initiatives moving forward, including: addressing systemic racism and unconscious bias; sound fiscal management; high quality instruction; learning loss and credit recovery; focus on student services and barriers to learning; completion of the Measure B Bond Program; and community engagement. Superintendent McFadden reported various educational opportunities that are provided at the District's campuses, including careers in Agricultural and Natural Resources, Hospitality, Tourism, and Recreation, Automotive studies, Entertainment. Residential and Commercial Arts and and construction. McFadden reported on current and future projects happening throughout the District provided by the Measure B Bond Program. Superintendent McFadden reported that the District has received a donation of an 86-acre ranch off McCourtney Road. Plans are under discussion to offer a hands-hand learning program at this location. Linda Melugin reported on the District's student scholarship opportunities for continuing education. They looked forward to returning to school next year.

ACTION TAKEN: Craig Griesbach, Building Director, and Jeff Merriman, Code Compliance Program Manager, provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding the revised Ordinance regarding Administrative Enforcement and Cannabis Cultivation. Revisions were made in response to the Board's concerns regarding the proposed Ordinance when it was originally introduced at the March 23, 2021 meeting. Supervisors Hall and Scofield met with staff to review the requested changes, which include revisions to the definition of "Responsible Party" to mirror the definition of "Violator" and the return of the term "reasonably" back into the Ordinance, to clarify what determines that a Code Violation exists.

Staff recommended the Board introduce and waive further reading of the proposed Ordinance.

Supervisors Hall and Scofield were on the Ad Hoc Committee to review revisions, and they were both in agreement that the revisions made the changes requested by the Board when it was first introduced in March.

Board discussion ensued.

Chair Miller provided an opportunity for public comment, and the following members of the public spoke: Diana Gamzon, Executive Director, Nevada county Cannabis Alliance; Mark Shafer, District IV; and Sarah Smale, District IV.

There being no further members of the public waiting to speak, Chair Miller closed public comment.

MOTION: Motion made by Supervisor Scofield, and seconded by Supervisor Hall, to introduce and waive further reading of the Ordinance. On a roll call vote the motion passed unanimously.

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### **Chief Information Officer: Stephen Monaghan**

Resolution approving the contract between the County of Nevada and Fire Safe Council of Nevada County pertaining to free residential green waste disposal for wildfire mitigation, in the total amount of \$124,243.76, for the period April 13, 2021 through July 16, 2021, authorizing the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute the contract, and directing the Auditor-Controller to amend the Fiscal Year 2020/21 Office of Emergency Services budget. (4/5 affirmative vote required) (Emergency Services)

Adopted.

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ACTION TAKEN: Paul Cummings, Office of Emergency Services Program Manager, and Jenn Tamo, Administrative Analyst, provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding the proposed contract with Fire Safe Council pertaining to free residential green waste disposal for wildfire mitigation. Administrative Analyst Tamo reported that the proposed contract aligns with the Board's Objective regarding wildfire mitigation, and encourages County residents to harden their properties against wildfire in both Eastern and Western County.

Jenn Tamo and Jamie Jones, Executive Director, Fire Safe Council, responded to the Board's questions, and discussion ensued. Supervisor Hall heard that Fire Safe Council will be distributing the green waste as mulch, so invasive plants, such as blackberry vines and scotch broom, will not be accepted. Administrative Analyst Tamo reported that invasive plants should be taken to the transfer station where they can be disposed of in the regular trash stream.

MOTION: Motion made by Supervisor Hall, and seconded by Supervisor Bullock, to adopt Resolution 21-119. On a roll call vote the motion passed unanimously.

Resolution approving the allocation of funding, the submittal of applications for funding, authorizing the Information and General Services Agency Director/Director of Emergency Services, or County Executive Officer to enter into and execute agreements and any amendments thereto, from the Community Development Block Grant 2017 Mitigation Resilient Infrastructure Program allocation for the County of Nevada, up to the amount of \$3,159,981. (Emergency Services)

Enactment No: RES 21-120

ACTION TAKEN: Jenn Tamo, Administrative Analyst, continued the presentation for the Office of Emergency Services, reporting on the allocation of Community Development Block Grant 2017 Mitigation Resilient Infrastructure Program funding from the California Department of Housing and Community Development in an amount up to \$3,159,981. Staff was notified that the County is eligible to apply for the funding. Administrative Analyst Tamo noted that the funding must be used for recovery and mitigation efforts following disasters such as wildfires. Certain zip codes throughout the State are considered highly impacted and distressed, which includes Yuba County. Therefore Nevada County's project will take place on the Western portion of the County to provide benefits to Yuba County.

Board questioning ensued.

Chair Miller provided an opportunity for public comment and Maggie Philipsborn, District IV, provided comments in support of the item. There being no more members of the public waiting to speak, Chair Miller closed public comment.

MOTION: Motion made by Supervisor Scofield, and seconded by Supervisor Bullock, to adopt Resolution 21-120. On a roll call vote the motion passed unanimously.
