ACTION TAKEN: Paul Cummings, Program Manager, Office of Emergency Services, reviewed the staff report regarding the Proclamation of Local emergency due to extreme drought and ongoing Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) events within the County. Program Manager Cummings reported that California is responding to a statewide drought, which directly affects Nevada County's environment, economy, and residents. Rainfall totals are lower than average throughout Nevada County, totaling 50% of normal as of April 30, 2021. With the extreme drought brings a heightened concern of wildfire and risk to Pacific Gas and Electric's (PG&E's) infrastructure, creating the likelihood of increased PSPS events. Program Manager Cummings requested the Board adopt the proposed proclamation of a local emergency.

Their feedback included: a need to place emphasis on employee training; the importance of data privacy; for the tool not to be used on permitted cultivators; and clear guardrails to ensure how the tool will be used. SUMMARY MINUTES

If implemented on a pilot basis, a UAS Program could show its the potential to: improve staff safety; improve program effectiveness and efficiency; improve customer service; support permitted cannabis industry; address Grand Jury recommendations; reduce long-term operational costs; and operate within all current policies and practices.

Chair Miller provided an opportunity for public comment, and the following members of the public spoke: Matthew Coulter, District III; Diana Gamzon, Executive Director, Nevada County Cannabis Alliance; Barbara Bashall, Governor Affairs Manager, Nevada County Contractors Association; Teresa Deitrich, District IV; and Wade Laughter, District I. There being no further members of the public waiting to speak, Chair Miller closed public comment

Board questioning and discussion ensued.

The Board arrived at a consensus, directing staff to return with a pilot program and analysis, providing for safeguards to ensure privacy for Nevada County residents.
