The Alta Sierra Property Owners Association supports the Grand Jury conclusions on marijuana enforcement.

Since the State did away with the cure period for marijuana code violations the County should implement immediate fines starting at the time of finding the illegal grow.

If the grow is palletized or easily relocated, it should be destroyed immediately.

The County could generate enough in fines to fund a robust enforcement program.

The request for drones is reasonable if they are only used on illegal marijuana grows. It would also be prudent to seek a drone model that has an infrared capability that could see covered grows or illegally large indoors grows.

The drones could accelerate fines that given the estimated 4000 grow sites would generate sufficient funds to have a real-time satellite contract.

Previous Grand Juries have call for Code Enforcement v Code Compliance model. When it comes to illegal grows it needs to be an enforcement model that has the NCSO firmly in the mix to deal with the worst actors.

If all of these were implemented, it would take a big bite out of the water thefts and animal poisonings.

The community in this time of drought emergency has no patience for the scale of water thefts we are seeing and that is another factor necessitating immediate action so there is water for People and food and none for illegal growers.
