**SUBJECT:** Resolution approving execution of Amendment No. 2 for the renewal Standard Agreement Number 21F-4029 with the State Department of Community Services and Development ("CSD") for funding of 2021 Community Services Block Grant ("CSBG") Programs to increase the maximum amount payable from \$279,667 to \$281,563 (an increase of \$1,896) for the term of January 1, 2021 through May 22, 2022. (RES 20-505; RES 21-185)

## **<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>**: Approve the attached resolution.

**FUNDING:** The County annually receives federal CSBG funds to support local services to low income residents of Nevada County. CSBG grants are allocated on a calendar year basis through a formula set by CSD. The allocated CSBG award for all agencies is listed in the Agreement's Attachment A - 2021 CSBG Allocation spreadsheet. Per the spreadsheet, the total calendar year 2021 amount for Nevada County was \$279,667. CSD has released an amendment providing an additional \$1,896, for a total of \$281,563. No budget amendment is required at this time. There are no county general fund dollars required in the Agreement.

**BACKGROUND:** As a condition of receipt and distribution of these funds, Nevada County must establish a list of priorities for addressing the needs of low-income residents through the development of a Community Action Plan ("CAP"). Per Resolution No. 19-381, the Board of Supervisors approved the 2020/21 Nevada County Community Action Plan and authorized its submittal to CSD, which was subsequently approved by the State. The CAP uses public input to develop goals and strategies and prioritize services to promote the goals of self-sufficiency among low income populations in its service area, and the Adult & Family Services Commission tripartite board is the designated entity to oversee the planning, implementation and evaluation of CSBG activities.

Per Resolution No. 20-505, the Board of Supervisors approved the Standard Agreement 21F-4029 on December 15, 2020 and was subsequently amended on June 8, 2021 per Resolution No. 21-185. The CSBG grant is unique in that the funding is discretionary; agencies choose how to spend funding in the most effective and efficient way for their community. A portion of CSBG grant

awards are distributed to community non-profit organizations in an effort to fill the gaps in social services and/or to provide support to existing priority services to eligible residents of Nevada County. The submitted CAP determined that funding should be directed to improve the conditions of people living in poverty in the following areas: affordable housing, mental health and addiction treatment, transportation, health & dental services and improving household income .

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached Amendment as the funding received will be used to sustain services through the upcoming calendar year.
